Ministerial Musings

Here we are in a foggy new year; the lights and decorations have been put away and Christmas is behind us. There were presents too, which, in some way, may have reminded us of the three kings, those wise men with their strange gifts. And so the story ends. Except it doesn't!

Those three kings, having called on King Herod in Jerusalem on their way to Bethlehem, went home by a different route. Herod, in his fury at being tricked, ordered all baby boys in Bethlehem to be killed. He didn't want a rival king, someone who might threaten his tin-pot power. Jesus escaped to Egypt with Mary and Joseph but others were not so fortunate. We normally ignore that part of the story; it's not very nice after all. But it happened and we do well to pay it attention. Herod slaughtered babies, the holy innocents, in his frantic urge to get rid of Jesus, the baby King of the Jews. We mustn't ignore the story, because Herod wasn't the last to kill children to protect his own position and further his own ambition.

We don't know how many babies were killed in Bethlehem, it isn't recorded anywhere, but today, many more children die every minute around the world because of poverty, hunger, war, abuse and preventable diseases. Every newspaper, magazine, social media and television report describes children as victims, sometimes the victims of violence inflicted by those who should love them the most of all.

Knowing this, if we do nothing, is it possible that we are somehow complicit in it? Modern-day Herods?

It seems that children still have plenty of Herods to fear. Today's holy innocents are the frightened children in Gaza and Bethlehem, the starving children in Yemen, the street children in Salvador and India, children abducted in Nigeria, children in refugee camps, abused children in our own communities.

None of that sounds very Christmassy and yet it is a part of the story. Jesus was born into a broken world of power struggles and ambitious rulers, of presidents who will not give up power. He came to earth knowing all that was wrong here. He came to offer a different way of living, a loving way of living. He came to be with those who were suffering; sharing and weeping over the sorrow and pain of others. He was born to live a life which faced all that was wrong in the world; faced the worst things head on – even death - and offered new hope even to the most hopeless situations.

Christians believe that this is not just ancient history. We believe that God is with us today in the suffering and sorrow of the pandemic; weeping for the pain of Uighurs, Rohinga, Syrians; loving the abused, the lonely, the lost; comforting the grieving and the frightened.

Christmas is not just a sweet story about a baby. It is about the reality of God with us in the fog of life's harshness and difficulty. It's about a challenge to join him in his work of loving care, no matter how hard that may be.





My regular surgeries will resume when it is safe to hold them again. In the meantime, please ring me anytime on **07733323581** if I can help you.



Chet Valley B-Line Update.

The CVB-Line is keen to promote the establishment of hedges as wildlife corridors and as habitat/food sources for pollinators such as bees and hoverflies. 2020 schemes were at Loddon Allotments, with the Loddon Parish Council and the Allotment Association planting a hawthorn hedge; near the Brian Clarke Rooms in Chedgrave led by Chedgrave Parish Council, planting a conservation hedge mix, and in Bergh Apton a 220m field boundary with a special pollinator hedge mix running down to the Chet. [All planted in line with the Covid 19 quidance].

Trees were provided by the Woodland Trust and the pollinator mix included Hawthorn, Blackthorn, Rowan, Hazel, Dogwood, Goat Willow and Dog Rose, they provide flowers at different times during spring and early summer. Hopefully, Ivy will self-establish providing late season nectar and pollen. The schemes involved 36 volunteers, who gave around 80 hours of their time. The Bergh Apton hedge was a two-day marathon in sticky clay with volunteers from Bergh Apton Conservation Trust, South Yare Wildlife Group and the Chet Valley B-Line pooling resources. We were grateful to local farmer Tony Kerry for helping by clearing the ground with his digger before planting. It was very good to see three children helping at Bergh Apton, quickly becoming adept at winding the guards round the plants.

Planting is only the first part of making sure hedges benefit wildlife. They then need maintenance to deliver benefits to wildlife. Cut back every year, they can't flower to provide nectar and pollen or then develop fruit for the birds later in the year. Hawthorn provides masses of early flowers, but only on second year wood so should not be cut more than once every 3 years as a minimum. If you wonder when to cut hedges to maximise wildlife benefit, the answer is now in late winter.

The Government has announced payments for Enhanced Hedge Management in 2022. We hope it is successful and has wide take up, more hedges in full bloom and perhaps less flailing!If you have any ideas for planting schemes or want some advice, contact us by email at chetvalleybline@gmail.com or via Facebook.

Loddon and District Local History

A new family home is nearing completion in Low Bungay Road, where for about 200 years a pair of cottages had stood. We did digs there and found some lovely Medieval potsherds. Later the cottages with bulging rotten brick walls were easily demolished. I wondered where the new bricks came from (Peterborough?) and the old ones, surely produced locally? In 1837 400 bricks from Mr Strowlger cost the Churchwardens 10/5^d.

Surely this was Mr John Strowlger who owned land near Southend House in Bungay Road. He had been paying land tax since at least 1826 and was described as a brickmaker at the baptism of his children. John and his wife and large family appear on the Census returns until her death in 1859 and his 10 years later. But by 1848 Henry Fayerman a grocer, son of Zaccheus, seems to have taken ownership of the business, and appears on Poll lists as owning a Brickground in High Bungay Road, both Strowlger & Fayerman appear in the Directory of 1850; as Brickmakers (Robert Campbell of Great Yarmouth Linen Draper has moved into Southend House).

Henry Fayerman, with his new wife Mary Ann, was recorded on the 1851 census in Loddon ,he seems to have returned to Great Yarmouth soon afterwards, until at least 1859. He had a house in Yarmouth as well as the Brickground in Loddon.

In 1859 there was a General Election. Not until 1872 were ballots secret and until then who those eligible to vote voted for was a matter of public knowledge. So in 1859 Young Henry who was in debt, (several hundred pounds) appears to have been approached by the Agents for the Conservative Candidates Sir Edmund Lacon & Sir Henry Stracey. Like some other members of his family he appears to have lacked discretion and made allegations that Sir Edmond Lacon himself had given him £5 for his vote (this was against the law). Eventually there was a hearing at Westminster where this and several charges of election irregularity and a trial at the Old Bailey where Fayerman was charged with perjury against Sir Edmund Lacon. This latter case was dismissed for lack of witnesses. The newspaper reports make confusing reading, making the point that one of the two must have been guilty. Henry's wife Mary Ann returned to Fritton and died in 1904. He shows on Electoral Rolls owning property in Burgh St Peter until 1896 but lived in Leeds working as a railway clerk.

It seems likely that Robert Campbell a draper who already owned Southend House purchased the Brickyards in 1860, and ran them until his death in 1882, when he left the property to his nieces who lived in Nottingham. By 1910 they have leased it to Lewis Elden the builder of many local houses, and the Smith family are producing bricks for him. They had both died by 1924. We have no evidence of when Brickmaking stopped in Loddon, but Lewis Elden died aged 88 in 1934.

We should remember that both Hales Hall and Holy Trinity Church were built of brick in the 15th century and that several fields in the parish are called Brick Kiln in 1840. There was a brickyard at Hales for many years, another topic for research. Keep safe.

Read Any Good Books Lately?

"The Dutch House," by Ann Patchett

In the USA a man buys a house complete with all its furniture and effects, after the previous owners died. There are portraits of those Dutch owners in the living-room, and the house itself is very grand, with decorated ceilings and stately furnishings throughout. The wife of the new owner hates it and eventually leaves both the house and her husband. Consequently, the husband remains in the house with the couple's children, who are looked after by a nanny, a cook and a housekeeper.

The father remarries and after his death a few years later his widow throws out both of her stepchildren, one of whom is by then a young adult and the other a young teenager. It is the latter, the son, who narrates most of the story throughout the book. We follow their careers and lives from then on, during which they are continually drawn back to the Dutch House and eventually the plot takes us, and them, full circle. This is a beautifully written book with some interesting and unusual characters.

"The Secret River," by Kate Grenville

The setting of this book begins in Nineteenth Century London, when poverty was extremely common amongst a great many people. Poverty only too often resulted in crime of one sort or another and in this case the theft of some stolen wood by a young father results in the whole family being sent to Australia to live and work there. A great deal of hardship was experienced by them in London and they soon find that again, life is by no means easy, once they arrive in Australia. In those times there was little or no understanding between the Aborigines and the settlers - many of whom had been sent there as a result of petty crimes back in England. White men were very afraid of the black colour of the Aborigines' skin, and vice versa. With no common language to aid either race, acceptance and understanding was bound to take a long time even to begin to develop between them. The author makes such things clear to the reader by writing with great sensitivity. She has created a very good and informative novel.

"Queenie Malone's Paradise Hotel," by Ruth Hogan

Ruth Hogan may be familiar to some readers as the author of "The Keeper of Lost Things." This is an equally extraordinary book, and it is really entertaining and imaginative. The central character is called Tilly. Tilly's father goes away when she is a young child, leaving her with her mother, Gracie. Tilly adored her father and doesn't believe he would ever leave them - she believes instead that Gracie has killed him. She also grows up believing all the time that her mother doesn't love her. After an unhappy and fairly impoverished time Gracie takes Tilly with her to live at the Paradise Hotel, which Queenie (a friend of Gracie's from years ago) owns in Brighton. Tilly's life is transformed. She and Gracie become happier - for Tilly the whole eccentric household is an absolute joy! She never forgets her father however, and never stops believing that her mother doesn't love her, until in her own adulthood, after Gracie dies, she finds Gracie's diaries.

There are some glorious characters in this book as well as an element of the supernatural running through it, also some sadness and lots of laughter. Definitely worth reading.

Nature Notes

Christmas fades and the New Year approaches fast, time to begin February's Nature Notes. One of my dog walks starts at Chedgrave Church. Standing under the oak tree by the back gate I see the movement of small birds in its branches. It's a flock of Long Tailed Tits searching for insects amongst the twigs. It is always worth checking Long Tailed Tit flocks in winter, often other small birds will be with them. With this group were also Blue and Great Tits, Goldcrest and a Tree Creeper, well worth the five minutes spent scanning the tree.

In December, I was privileged to be taken on a guided tour of Dickleburgh Moor, and saw four Green Sandpipers. They used to overwintering round the dykes where we live, but I have not seen any these last two years.

I made a return trip to Covehythe Broad and there had been even more erosion, so the path to the beach was flooded. I saw a Long-Tailed Duck, unexpected though one had been seen the previous week. Normally they are on the sea and often just a small dot in the distance, but this one was very obliging and gave some terrific views.

Across the fields from Hardley Street to the Staithe I was entertained by both a Barn Owl and a Short-Eared Owl, which was a bonus while walking the dogs. I know the Short-Eared Owl has been around for a while but until now I have only seen it perched in the bushes on the left of the Staithe. This time it was flying low across the fields along with the Barn Owl, both just ahead of us heading towards the Staithe where several photographers were waiting to photograph them. We have during December regularly seen Barn Owls at several local locations, whereas for most of the rest of the year they have been noticeably invisible.

While volunteering at Earsham Wetland Centre the other Thursday, I was enjoying my lunch by the building when a sudden movement caught my eye. Initially I thought it was a Grey Squirrel following the fence line towards me, but quickly realised that it was a Stoat showing the diagnostic black tip to its tail. I saw another one today out walking the dogs near Hales Common, it ran across the road in front of us though both my dogs were oblivious to it. As we got to the place it had disappeared into a hedge, it reappeared and ran back in front of us and this time my terrier wanted to give chase but fortunately, he was on his lead.

The Pink Footed Geese seem to have found pastures new and no longer fly regularly overhead. Flocks of Fieldfare and Redwing are also less often heard or seen having stripped the local berries they have also move on.

I have been lucky to see several Kingfishers locally, one flew right in front of me at Hardley Staithe, flashing blue and orange. It crossed the Staithe and directly in front of a couple walking on the opposite bank, but from their lack of reaction I don't think they saw it, even though it was only a couple of feet in front of them at eye level.

Again, in December, a number of birds were displaying as if it was spring, especially dunnocks but also wrens and black headed gulls. What do they know that we don't?

We start the New Year in lockdown but that doesn't stop us being observant and enjoying the natural world around us even if it is through a window. As a child my parents would take me out for walks this time of year looking for signs of Spring, so why not give it a go and see what you can find.

Gardening Notes

From the Allotment

Something slightly different this month as I would like to recommend a book to you. This is The Garden Jungle (or gardening to save the planet) by Dave Goulson. (You may recognize the name from some disturbing recent news resulting from his research that insecticides used on our pets to kill fleas are finding their way in our rivers and streams.) I found myself reading this book twice. Once for enjoyment and once to take notes of all the useful information and advice.

I was particularly taken by the chapter (12) in which the virtues of allotments are rightly extolled. If you think the countries 330,000 allotments are messy shambles think again. They are astonishingly productive with between 4 and 11 times the weight of produce that an intensively farmed arable field can produce, and without all the pesticides and fertilizers.

So, we allotment holders are outperforming all the decades of farming research and investment. The reason is simple we can pack in more crops, particularly by growing different crops together – catch crops. This more closely mirrors a natural ecosystem and supports far more wildlife. There is also plenty of research to confirm allotments and gardening are beneficial to our physical and mental health.

The book also explains something I have wondered about, which is why you see so many allotments close to railway lines? You could cheat and google this, but you would learn a lot more from reading the book.

Back to my main purpose. Now is the second opportunity to plant broad beans but your focus should be on getting ready for the coming year: planning, digging, mulching, and manuring.
