April is a month of promise: the promise of Spring and fairer weather and the promise offered to all by the Easter message. There is no more beautiful witness to the mystery of Easter than nature bursting with new life and colourful flowers. The image of new life is everywhere if we take time to notice and listen to the wonder and love of God. Time and again God shows his love and presence in the world through his creation and all that surrounds us.

In the church our joyous Easter celebrations are preceded by the most sombre week of the church year; on Palm Sunday we recall the moment when Jesus rode triumphantly into the holy city of Jerusalem, to cries of 'Hosanna!'. The pain we feel when someone we love dies can feel too much to bear, and is heart-wrenching and awful. But knowing they have gone to a better place, where there is no more pain, no more tears, and only goodness and light, and that we will see them there one day, can bring us a deep sense of peace and comfort that nothing else can give.

This is what God has promised for all of us (Yes! Even YOU!).

If you want to find out more, do join us at any of our Easter services or get in touch. The Easter Bunny will spread quite a lot of joy (who doesn't look forward to a chocolate egg?), but the gift of joy and hope that is ours for the taking is everlasting, and we can't wait to share it with you.

The government is consulting on devolution

for Norfolk and Suffolk and wants your opinion on whether you think a mayor for both counties is a good idea. The closing date is 13th April and you can find the survey here:

https://consult.communities.gov.uk/lggc/norfolk-and-suffolk-devolution-consultation.

You may have read about Local Government reorganisation in the press, abolishing the eight councils to replace them with new unitary authorities, one stop shops for all council services. Over the summer you will be consulted on the shape of these and whether we should have one, two or three councils in Norfolk. The rationale for the change is to be more efficient and provide better value for money. There are certainly some big savings to be made which will free up more money for front line services; also fewer Chief Executives on large salaries and fewer councillors. This is the greatest shake up in local government for 50 years, so we have to get it right. Your opinion will be important in helping government to decide on the best option.



Proposed Development of Langley Road Industrial Estate: The council has been advised by South Norfolk Council Planning that they have confirmed to the applicant that permission for Langley Road Industrial Estate cannot be supported primarily due to non-compliance with Chet Neighbourhood Plan Policy 11 (Protecting Key Employment Sites) and the scale of the proposed development.

Rumble Strip Trial: NCC Highways will be installed on 17th March. The SAM2 sign will be positioned to record the results of the trial which will be communicated in due course.

Wherryman's Way: County Councillor Kay Mason-Billig reported that works to fully reinstate the Wherryman's Way are unlikely to go ahead due to the state of the ground and riverbank. Alternative routes will be considered with the aim of avoiding Hardley Road.





Loddon and District Local History Group

The February meeting started with the AGM chaired by Bryon Sparkes.

Bryon mentioned Carol Webb's efforts in producing a new edition of the Guided Historical Walk of Loddon and in organising the digitalisation of the Primitive Methodist Chapel Roll of Honour. Bryon would like the original to go to the Imperial War Museum.

Bryon led two test pits last year at Hardley Hall and a geophys study is planned for this year. Elvie reported that the website continues to grow with as many as 100 visitors on some days. Currently we have £2000 in the bank which will be used to book a variety of speakers.

All the committee are prepared to stand again: Bryon, Elvie, Christine, Anne, Alison and Carole. We do need others to help with meetings and cataloguing.

For the rest of the meeting Elvie gave us an interesting talk on Loddon Ingloss. This is the largest farm estate in the parish at just over 300 acres and is mentioned on the 1840 tithe map where it shows that the farm was mainly arable. The land had been given to Langley Abbey until the dissolution of the monasteries when it was taken over by the crown. The land was sold in the eighteenth century to the Berney family who rented it out to tenant farmers. Tax records, poll books and wills give us information about these owners and farmers.

One family that stands out is the Alexanders who rented the land for much of the eighteenth century starting with Samuel, mentioned in the overseers' accounts in 1741. The Alexanders were pillars of the community. Both Samuel and William Alexander acted as church wardens in Loddon. William even collected the tithes for the Bishop of Ely. They have a large tomb in Loddon churchyard.

The Ingloss estate was sold to the Parkerson family in the early nineteenth century and then changed hands several times before being bought by the Symonds family. In 1904, Nathaniel Symonds was taken to court for cruelty to working horses. He was fined £5 and warned. He died in 1911 with effects of £7,590. Various people then ran the farm until Mr G. Daplyn sold both the farm and stock in 1951. Mr A. Young is listed as running the farm in 1962.



Read Any Good Books Lately?

Atomic Habits, by James Clear

This non-fiction book is full of simple life hacks to help you make real and sustainable changes. The author James Clear has discovered that real change comes from the compound effect of hundreds of small decisions—doing two push-ups a day, waking up five minutes early, or holding a single short phone call. He calls them atomic habits. There are some inspiring stories of Olympic gold medallists, leading CEOs and distinguished scientists who have used the science of tiny habits to stay productive, motivated and happy. What I particularly liked about this book was that it feels achievable and might actually work for me!

A Secret Garden, by Katie Fforde

Katie Fforde has written many romantic novels and this is one of her older ones but it's still a nice, gentle read. Gardening Notes

Growing Fruit and Veg from Scratch: Part 6a Crop Rotation

In the last articles I discussed various mulches and techniques to maintain soil health. Crop rotation is also important. Avoid growing the same crops in the same place each year as this causes pests and diseases to build up and the same crops will take the same nutrients out of the soil reducing its fertility. Adding organic matter and rotating crops can keep a healthy soil going indefinitely. Potatoes and brassicas are particularly prone to soil pests. Onions are susceptible to white rot if grown in the same place. There are generally agreed rotations which are known to work from long experience. On an allotment a basic four-rotation plan would be:

Potatoes \rightarrow Roots \rightarrow Brassicas \rightarrow Peas & Beans \rightarrow Potatoes.

Potatoes are a hungry crop so manure in autumn/spring. You can plant leeks once new potatoes are harvested. If you add lime after harvest this will the most effect when the brassicas arrive in the rotation. **Roots** add compost in autumn/spring. You can plant a green manure over winter. **Brassicas** manure in autumn/spring. Brassicas tend to be slow growing and so ideal for planting lettuce, radish or other quick growing crops between rows. **Peas & Beans** add compost in spring or, as I do, plant over trenches filled with raw compost. After harvest plant overwintering brassicas so they will be in the correct space. The key to rotation is simple; keep a record of where you plant things each year! A bit more detail next time.

From Another Garden

Well it's all happening out there. The recent days of glorious full sunshine have opened the bright faces of so many blooms. Even the poor neglected bulbs I planted late in January are coming up with buds on. After sawing up the wood pile and getting 'Arnold Schwarzenegger' arm for my toils, I can now see the many blooms under the apple tree from the kitchen window. I'd forgotten how many species of spring flower we have. Each year as they naturalise, the carpet of colour grows.

I have been excavating a very long metal scaffold pole! Perhaps it held up a washing line in the past; it is right in the middle of a planned flower bed. I'm about three feet down and still it won't come out!

The seeds I sowed in February are up and ready to be pricked out. In the greenhouse this month I've potted up lots of lily corms (corms actually being short, swollen underground stems modified for storage as opposed to bulbs which are modified leaves that store nutrients). Seeds of tall antirrhinums, double white Aquilegia vulgaris and African marigolds have been sown and for a local man I've put in a packet of hellebore seeds which may take 18 months to germinate.

It looks as though the cannas have survived the winter, together with the dark blue salvias and chrysanthemums, so now I'm dividing up the plants. I love that with patience, an initially expensive plant can become many and that the nurturing of them creates a real relationship over time. Yes, I do talk to my green leafy friends.
