### **Ministerial Musings**

One night in October, when my niece was little, I told her that she would have to put her clock back. She replied, "I don't have a clock". Children do take adults literally! This year on the 27<sup>th</sup> of October the clocks go back an hour. British Summer Time will be over for another year as we return to Greenwich Mean Time.

A few years ago, I travelled to France and Belgium over the last weekend in October. Our watches were showing BST and on arrival we had to put them on an hour to Central European Time. Then on the Sunday we had to put our watches back an hour, and then, as we arrived back in England, they had to go back another hour to GMT! That was very confusing.

Standardisation of time came about because of rail travel. Each large town had its own time which matched the position of the sun but as trains started travelling greater distances, all these different times caused confusion.

Putting clocks forward originated during WWI to provide what was called daylight savings. During WW2 double summer time was introduced which meant daylight lasted well into the evening. There have been experiments and discussions around whether clocks should be altered but for now, we fall back an hour in October and spring forward an hour in March.

All this made me think about time and how we view it. How often do we say that we don't have time, or that time flies? For some people time drags, others need to kill time because they have too much time on their hands. We know that when we're having fun time seems to go quickly.

Time is in God's hands. In Ecclesiastes we read that there is a time and a season for everything (*Ecclesiastes 3:1-8*). God's perspective of time is different from ours. The psalmists wrote that 'A thousand years in God's sight are like yesterday' (*Psalm 90:4*), and that 'My time is in your hands' (*Psalm 31:15*). Time changes and we might change with the times too, but God remains the same yesterday, today and tomorrow.

Cllr Deb Downer will try and escalate this with our county councillor, express the council's extreme disappointment and seek assurance that existing funding will be ringfenced for future work.

### **Notes from Sisland**

Writing this at the start of September, when the sun is shining but the glow and mists of autumn are present in the early morning, I want to take the opportunity to thank all those who supported the Sunday Teas at Sisland church throughout the month of August. Not only an opportunity to catch up with friends, old and new, but for the latter to be able to appreciate the beauty of the building and the years of history that it contains.

As you will be aware the maintenance and care for this building takes both time and effort as well as a range of fundraising. Sisland is an incredibly small parish and so the money raised by the Sunday Teas, our main event of the year, is key to the investment we can make in providing support for this building now and to make it available for future generations to benefit from the peace and tranquillity that it provides. As one visitor stated, "It is a place to contemplate and remember everyone who has gone before us."

At the end of last month, the horse chestnut tree on the edge of the churchyard lost a large branch overnight. Fortunately, no damage occurred to the gravestones at that corner of the churchyard but we have asked for an arboriculturist to check the health of the tree. The horse chestnut is native to the Balkan Peninsula. It was first introduced to the UK from Turkey in the late 16<sup>th</sup> century. Although rarely found in woodland, it is a common sight in public parks and lining our streets. The stunning candle like flowers, which appear in the spring, provide a rich source of nectar and pollen for insects. Caterpillars of the horse chestnut leaf-miner moth provide food for blue tits. Obviously the most famous use of the horse chestnut is the game of conkers. The first record of the game comes from the Isle of Wight in 1848, though there are diary references earlier in the century, and in 1965 the World Conker Championships were set up in Ashton (near Oundle) in Northamptonshire.

If work needs to be done on the tree, we will place signs in the church and may need to restrict access to the car park temporarily. We hope that this was just bough drop and nothing more. The church will continue to be open through the remainder of the year and we hope to see you soon.







### **Loddon and District Local History Group**

The August talk was on the history of Spinning, Weaving & Dying by Susan Cranmer. Susan arrived laden with looms, spindles, samples of fabrics and books, plus the memory stick with her interesting presentation. I had always thought that the spinning was women's work and the weaving was done by the men; not so. In the wonderful illustrations she showed, from mediaeval manuscripts, were beautifully dressed ladies, with protective aprons, spinning with distaff and drop spindles with other ladies weaving on vertical looms and in later pictures on horizontal looms. Only when the work moved into the towns did men take over.

Evidence of spinning apparently goes back to the Stone Age. Early looms only allowed simple weaving, though patterns were possible by either varying the colours of yarn or the number of threads the bobbin passed over and under. One of the small looms Susan showed us was for making tapes which were used to decorate clothing made from the plain cloths. The ladies would also have 'woven' the laces to fasten their clothes and the lace in sleeves.

The width of fabric was determined by the length of the weaver's arms, about 36 inches, as they had to push the shuttle across the loom between the warp threads. Wider fabric required two weavers to sit side by side. When mechanical ways of raising the warp threads were developed using heddles, which were raised and lowered with foot pedals, then patterns were easier to create. Later on, after weaving became industrialised, the Jacquard looms were introduced and the variety of patterns became infinite. A Norfolk Jacquard Loom still survives in the Bridewell Museum.

Norfolk with its wealth of grazing land was well provided with sheep that were bred for their wool. There were strict rules imposed on the production and sale of the woollen cloth, with restrictions and/or taxes on selling fleeces and yarn abroad. In 1550 'The Strangers' were invited to come across from the Low Countries to revive the weaving industry which had fallen on hard times. Hundreds had arrived by the end of the 16<sup>th</sup> century. However, without fast flowing streams and rivers, Norfolk could not develop the big factories of the North during the Industrial Revolution, though the popularity of Norfolk shawls during the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries provided weavers with work for a while. A fascinating afternoon.

#### After that Night by Karin Slaughter

Sara is a doctor, who had an exceptionally promising career ahead of her, until she was attacked and her life was sent spinning off track. She's come to terms with what happened to her, but certain things act as a trigger, when a girl is brought to the emergency room, after being attacked and stalked, she decides to try and help justice be done. 

### **Nature Notes**

By the time you read this article, Autumn will be well upon us and, all being well, we can enjoy the various hews of reds, oranges, and browns that adorn our deciduous trees. Our Summer migrant birds will have left for warmer climes and will be replaced by birds seeking better conditions from further north. During this month we should be serenaded by skeins of pink footed geese. Fieldfares and redwings (winter thrushes) should be arriving. Will this be a waxwing year when we see a large influx of this colourful bird, or will they be a scarcity? We will have to wait and see.

Back to the here and now in early September as I write this, swallows were noticeable for their absence at Hardley Staithe as I walked our dogs late morning, though I had seen them earlier over our home and on our way to Seething. Yes, I have reverted to walking our dogs late morning, though I enjoyed the early morning walks in the cool of the day, I found getting up that early was taking its toll on me. Since last writing, the only different bird species I have seen down there is a large white egret, which initially I took to be a mute swan flying towards the shooting pits, then quickly realised my mistake as the flight was wrong for a swan. A couple of weeks back a friend messaged me saying a black redstart was around the staithe. It had gone by the time I got there, but I was sent a couple of beautiful photographs of the bird. Black redstart is a robin-sized bird, mostly grey/black in colour with a rusty orange rump and tail.

The fox I mentioned last month was at the staithe on three consecutive mornings. I was also entertained by a stoat early one morning that kept running back and forth on the path. One day I will get a photo of their playful inquisitive nature.

Talking of photos, a couple of evenings back I left our home to check our feeding station. There were no birds but at the base of it was a young hedgehog, which I did manage to capture on my phone. I have also managed to get a few shots of obliging dragonflies.

The other day at Seething I noticed what I took to be a piece of plastic glinting in the sun. On closer inspection it turned out to be the cast-off skin of a grass snake. It reminded me of a box of treasures I had as a child which included a complete grass snake skin along with a foot-long sun-dried pipe fish (no it didn't smell) and other goodies. I also had, from a later age, a Barn Owl pellet that I had taken apart in water, dried and mounted the various bones. If my memory serves me well it contained bones from a field vole, bank vole and shrew. Sadly, my collection has got lost in the mists of time.

Do wrap up warm, and go out and see just what you can see.

### **Gardening Notes**

#### Growing Fruit and Veg from Scratch—Part 5c: Soil Health

The recent archaeological investigation in Chedgrave demonstrated the lack of topsoil and prompted a friend into remembering a farmer's description of Chedgrave's "hungry old land". So it's timely I am continuing the theme of sustainably improving soil health.

The best manure I ever had was from a farming friend who had reluctantly sold off his dairy herd and several years later steeled himself to clearing the yard and buildings. I helped and received a rich bounty of well-rotted manure but applied it too thickly across all the garden. I got a lot of very leafy growth, but a significant long term improvement in the soil. Cow manure in small amounts is not usually available, but you can usually find horse manure. If it's coming from the stable door or cow shed, it is typically quite fresh and needs to be kept up to a year before use, otherwise it will draw nitrogen from the soil as it rots. When storing it is best to keep the rain and air out to stop the nutrients disappearing.

You can buy manure dried in bags, but this will already have lost some nutrients and the straw that is useful in building soil structure. Also remember weed seeds will survive the passage through animal stomachs so expect a fine crop of these as well. If you keep rabbits or chickens, then their manure can be added to your compost bins as an activator. If you want to find out about using 'humanure' read Bob Flowerdew's Organic Bible.

There's a noticeable change in the air, the smell of drying leaves and something poignant. A certain finality knowing that after I've enjoyed harvesting my crops, everything will either die back or go into dormancy until next year.

I have been cutting the hedge in sections with Dad's old shears. Partly because it is the environmentally friendly way and mostly because I cannot be bothered to get the electric flex out of the shed. I have also used them to cut back the *Hotlips* salvia and enormous lavender bushes, which until recently were so full of bees they were positively joyful. My secateurs have also been busy of late, dead-heading, cutting back the dead stems of finished plants and tidying up the roses and pot grown trees. The lack of water for several months has taken its toll on the Bramley tree, despite pouring our bath water around the roots, so many fruits have dropped and they

Outside the kitchen window are hanging baskets still with plenty of ruby jewels of *Tumbling Toms*, tomatoes; perfect for popping into my mouth as I pass by. Despite a dry year and being away for a month we have enjoyed our harvest. I grew melons for the first time, they are rather small as are my pumpkins. The Autumn-fruiting raspberries have been so sweet and juicy. Lots of little cucumber *La Diva*, a few Butternut squash, giant red celery (which isn't very big but very tasty) and heaps of tomatoes, my beans are only just getting going and the squirrel has taken all the hazel nuts. All the same I am very grateful for our bounty.
