
Worship in the Chet Valley

News from Your Local Councillors Norfolk



By now, disruption on the A146, while new bus stops are installed and the footpaths built, should have ceased. I know how annoying roadworks can be and apologise for any inconvenience caused, however if we want improvements, we have to endure some pain whilst they are being built.

The unfortunate consequence of this (despite doing it during the school holidays when there is less traffic) is that many more vehicles have chosen to rat run through Loddon and Chedgrave to avoid the traffic lights. Many of them totally ignoring the 20mph speed limit. It is so disappointing, sticking to the speed limit would hardly make any difference to someone's overall journey but would make it so much safer for pedestrians.

I asked the police to attend to see if that would help (once the word got out that there was a chance of being caught). It had some effect, but they can't be here all the time. I'm asking again, please slow down through the built-up areas, there really is no need to use our roads like a racetrack.







Loddon and District Local History Group

In June we had a fascinating talk about the "Flora on a Stick" by Andrew Tullett. Andrew has made it his mission to record all the Norfolk town & village signs. The earlies ones were in the 1920's around the Sandringham Estate. Some villages have more than one sign. Plants and flowers appear on many signs recalling specific connections with the locality,

Our July meeting took us to Langley Hall now better known as Langley School. We were welcomed by Nigel who gave a brief history of the house and estate from the Reformation when it was owned by the Abbey, Richard Berney bought it from Henry VIII and it passed down through his family to another Richard "Recorder Berney" who in 1740 was in financial difficulties and sold it to George Proctor whose sister married the first baronet.

George left it to William and his wife on condition they took the name Beauchamp-Proctor. For nearly 250 years, the family lived here, each adding and changing as they saw fit. We were guided around the main rooms of the house to see plaster work, painted ceilings, fireplaces and views. The school has been working hard to maintain and preserve the rooms, often seeking advice from experts including from the V&A Museum.

From 1946 the school took over the estate and the rooms were in daily use by staff and students. As the school expanded, classrooms and laboratories and a new library have been built and now the rooms are mainly used by the Head and administrative staff. Our 2-hour tour finished with tea and cakes in the Ballroom. Thanks go to Langley School and Nigel.





Nature Notes

Summer has passed and Autumn is upon us, migrant birds like swifts are long gone. Normally around until early August, this year they had packed up and gone by the fourth week of July. Well, what have I seen during June and July. A trip to Minsmere in July initially produced nothing new, then as we were leaving, I noticed people on a track with scopes and quickly pulled up. They had found an obliging Stone Curlew in full view about 20 yards in front of us. The other bird I saw, again not expecting to see this year, was a Turtle Dove, Rachel and I saw it on telephone wire at Seething. I had just got back to where Rachel was standing when she said she was sure she had heard a Turtle Dove purring, but that it had stopped. Then it flew up from the field and settled od the wires. My year list for birds seen or heard round the Hardley Staithe area has increased to 92 for the year, will I reach 100, who knows. Recent additions have been a Green Woodpecker, Water Rail which I only heard and a Bittern. Other highlights from May not included in the June magazine occurred driving to Seething. Two hares suddenly appeared in the road in front of us, quickly followed by a third. The first two veered off into a field but we still slowly followed the third, this was then joined by another coming toward us, it turned and ran, only to be joined by a fifth. The last two quickly "escaped" into a field but hare three seemed determined to stay in the road, finally shooting off into a field, a lovely shared experience. One day in June I took the dogs to Rockland Broad and as we were returning to the car park, a Cuckoo called from the overheard. Suddenly there was an awful noise that with my hearing aids in, I found almost deafening. It was the "warble" of a female Cuckoo, a sound I have never heard before. Then low and behold I heard another one "warbling" at Hardley Staithe a couple weeks later. I must admit I did feel sorry for the male Cuckoo having experienced the call of the female.

You never know what you might come across in our amazing countryside. Even sitting here typing this a pair of Wood Pigeons have been enjoying the rain, using it as a shower, so you don't even need to go out.

Gardening Notes

Growing Fruit and Veg from scratch: Part 8 Tools

This is the final part of Growing Fruit and Veg from scratch and for the sake of completeness is about the tools, etc you need when starting off. The basics are a spade, fork, trowel, hand fork, rake, watering can, wheelbarrow and secateurs.

Later you will probably also need a dibber (it's easy to make your own), a line (ditto), a hoe, strimmer, shears, a hosepipe and maybe a polytunnel. You will need to buy other things regularly used, canes, twine, netting, compost, plant feed ...etc. There is probably no need to buy seed trays or flowerpots as garden centres give old ones away and you quickly accumulate a stash as soon as you start buying plants. You can also accumulate useful bits of wood, plastic sheeting, metal for projects.

As with all tools used regularly durability is important It's better to spend a little to get ones that last or get them from charity shops, garage sales, car boots or relatives. Always keep tools clean, sharp and oiled.

Spades and forks come in many shapes, weights and sizes. I prefer ones with a wooden handle as though they can break if mistreated/left out in elements too long, they don't bend like plastic ones which once bent tend to keep doing it. I find longer handles and smaller blades are better for backs! Have a good summer.


