Ministerial Musings

The Cross on the Cover

On the front cover of this Chet Contact is a cross. It's the logo of the Chet Valley Churches, and if you look carefully you can identify the churches in Loddon, Chedgrave, Sisland, Hardley, Langley, Hales and Heckingham. But what made us choose it?

This month it will be Easter, with chocolate eggs and spring lambs. It's the most important event in the church's year, and the reason why we chose a cross for our logo. It is crucial to the Christian faith—the word 'crucial' comes from the Latin word 'crux' meaning a cross.

The events of the first Easter went like this:

Jesus was unpopular with religious and secular leaders since he taught with authority because he was God's son. He didn't impose rules, but focussed on God's love.

Jesus knew that the leaders wanted to kill him, and on the day we call Maundy Thursday he ate a last meal with his friends, preparing them for what was to happen.

Jesus was arrested, and although he was innocent, he was condemned to death by crucifixion, the cruellest of ways to die. We call the day Good Friday, because when Jesus died good overcame evil.

On the day we call Easter Sunday the tomb where Jesus's body had been laid was empty, because he had come back to life. He taught that the events of Easter meant it was now possible for people (including us) to know God and to be forgiven for all our wrong thoughts and actions. That's amazing!

Because of Easter we can have a real faith in God who cares about us no matter what happens to us. The cross isn't a prop to stop us falling over. Rather, it is the way through which we can know God as a friend and guide. It also enables us to be the best possible version of the person we were born to be. That's why we use it as a logo, and why Easter is the most wonderful celebration of the church's year. If you are able, do come and celebrate Easter in church or join us online.

Holy Communion is celebrated every Sunday at one or other of the Chet Valley Churches, either Book of Common Prayer or Common Worship, with an informal Holy Communion service once a month in Chedgrave.



Over Easter we'll again be distributing flowers and Easter eggs to our over-60s friends and neighbours; please let me have any names of anyone you would like to nominate.



On 20th April, Loddon WI will be celebrating its 92nd birthday with a party and a 'Sing-a-long with Hank' session.







Norfolk Home Library Service

Norfolk home library expands service and calls for new users and volunteers.

Calling all book lovers and digital masters! A popular home library service delivered by Royal Voluntary Service and the Norfolk Library and Information Service is looking to expand throughout Norfolk.

A new digital inclusion program is also being trialled, in which specially trained volunteers teach the service's clients how to access critical information digitally, and how to download books online. The expansion means that the Home Library Service is looking to welcome new clients, volunteers, and Volunteer Coordinators to the team.

Volunteers work alongside their local library to select and deliver books and other media to those who may find it difficult to leave the house, have mobility issues, or caring responsibilities. The service also provides regular, friendly social contact to check if clients are safe and well, to discuss reading and listening preferences, and to report any concerns to appropriate services as needed.

Volunteer Coordinators liaise with local libraries, manage a network of local volunteers to arrange book deliveries, recruit new volunteers, and build relationships with local community groups to promote the service. As part of the new digital inclusion program, Digital Service Coordinators may offer their skills in workshops to train volunteers to use various devices, apps, and programs that the service's clients may find challenging.

Alicia Stillman, Service Manager for Royal Voluntary Service Norfolk Home Library Service says: "For people who find leaving their homes problematic, the Home Library Service offers a vital link to the local library and a welcome connection with a friendly face. The Covid-19 pandemic has shone a light on the significant number of vulnerable adults living in isolation. During the last two years, it has also become apparent that many socially isolated people were not able to access vital information due to digital illiteracy. Instruction on downloading eBooks, accessing GP and Council services, and setting up video conferencing can often be more easily explained in person, in an informal setting, one on one. Through the new digital inclusion program, with the help of our dedicated volunteers, we hope to bring clients back to the activities they love, prevent further isolation, and provide companionship and support."

Loddon and District Local History Group

The meeting on 16th February was both the AGM and then a talk by Robin Sampson. Carol Webb chaired the AGM and outlined the work of the group over the last two years:

- Bryon Sparkes has organised digs at Lodge Farm, The Angel and a garden in Langley.
- Graveyard surveys and markers have been updated at Hardley, Langley, Heckingham and Raveningham by Elvie Herd and a large band of helpers.
- Displays in Youngs' windows have shown 'local churches' followed by 'oddities'.
- Elvie has organised two displays in Loddon Church, one on tithe maps and the other on heraldry
- Stalls were set up at 'Loddon Unlocked' and the Victorian Evening.
- Two new publications are on sale: 'The Changing Face of Chedgrave and the Riverside' and 'Aspects of Wartime in Loddon '.
- Elvie and Peter Webster digitised nearly all the maps.

Bryon, the Treasurer, said finances were good with over £1,200 in the bank enough to finance future projects. The programme of speakers for the rest of this year is nearly complete. The summer outing is to Raveningham Gardens on 10th June (provisionally). The committee stepped down and were then voted back unanimously.

Robin Sampson, Manager of the Community Archives run by the Norfolk Record Office, outlined the support offered to Local History groups like Loddon. His aim was to provide training, support and resources through a project started in 2020. Groups were invited to make an application to join with just over 30 being chosen, including Loddon. Those accepted were divided into six different cohorts who were given ten meetings in tailored sessions while equipment was provided to help with each group's collections.

There were three main areas of help offered: cataloguing archive collections; helping preserve these collections; digitising old photographs and postcards. Each group was given a budget of up to £250 for preservation materials of which Loddon History Group has taken advantage. Advice and training were also given on the best storage conditions. Loddon was given a digitising kit including a camera, stand and dedicated laptop with software. Peter found the processing of the images very time-consuming. After the meeting we were able to see the results of this digitising when we enjoyed a fascinating PowerPoint showing views of Loddon and surrounding villages taken in the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries.

Read Any Good Books Lately?

The Arrival by Shaun Tan

This wordless graphic novel is a phenomenon which has been widely praised and awarded. I wanted to include it this month because it's about the displacement of people and their journeys and how they can find themselves without their families. It's a beautiful tribute to refugees everywhere and I really recommend reading it. The surrealist artwork is stunning and draws you into a very different imagined world. It's suitable for children over 8.

The Coward by Jarred McGinnis

The Coward is an autobiographical novel. Jarred's mother dies when he is young and his father, already an alcoholic, becomes abusive and neglectful. Jarred runs away as soon as he can and lives the life of a drifter, living from hand to mouth. But then a car accident makes him a paraplegic and the only person he can call is his (reformed) father. The journey that Jarred takes us on is a very emotional one, at its heart is the broken, damaged relationship with his father. Although it sounds like a misery memoir it's actually darkly funny and heart-warming.

Salt to the Sea by Ruta Sepetys

I had no knowledge of the greatest maritime disaster of all time until I read this book. 9000 lives were lost when the German boat, Gusthoff Wilhem, was torpedoed by the Russians in the dying stages of WW2. Although this is based on historical fact the characters are all imagined. The author has purposefully chosen the weakest and those least able to decide their destiny when their lives become ravaged by war. Told in short chapters, each character takes their turn to add their perspective as the story unfolds. It's heart-breaking but also a wonderful testament to the human spirit.

Again, Rachel by Marion Keyes

The story of Rachel and her battle with drug addiction in Rachel's Holiday has always been my favourite Marion Keyes book so I was eager to read the sequel (which she said she'd never write!). We come back to the familiar character of Rachel, who is now working in an addiction clinic, as head counsellor. The book focuses a lot on the help various characters receive with their addictions, while gradually revealing that Rachel is still in recovery herself. There is a very moving and harrowing account of the loss of a baby and how the characters cope, or don't, with the grief striking in its raw honesty. But there is also humour, lightness and joy. I very much enjoyed it!

Nature Notes

It almost seems flippant to be writing these nature musings with all that is going on in Ukraine in early March, and who knows how things will have developed by the time this comes out in April. We are praying for peace.

My year list of birds has increased to 137. My first sortie out in February was to Hen Reedbeds at and Walberswick. Fortunately, the tide was out on Blythburgh Estuary, and I quickly spotted a grey plover out on the mudflats.




There were also avocets, curlews, dunlin, redshank, black tailed godwit, oyster catcher and ringed plover. I failed to locate the glaucous gull supposedly at the far end of the estuary, so I decided to check through the gulls that were loafing around on a sandbank in front of me: herring gull, common gull, mediterranean gull, black headed gull. Then, there it was, a juvenile glaucous gull, much larger than its companions and biscuit-coloured.

I moved onto Walberswick, where a glossy ibis had been reported in the field inland from the shore car park. It was easy to pick out with its iridescent dark feathers. Glossy ibis, a few years ago, would have been a major rarity, but no longer; in fact, there have been up to three birds in our area, the other two being at Lowestoft and Rockland. I then made my way along the beach towards Dunwich, in search of three more species. I quickly saw a short-eared owl disappearing into the reeds. Checking every redshank I saw on the shore pools in the hope of finding a spotted redshank, another winter visitor, I suddenly struck lucky. Both species standing together enabled me to easily observe their differences. The final bird I was hoping to see was a twite, a sparrow-sized bird similar to a linnet. As there was only a handful of this winter bird between Dunwich and Walberswick, and time was running out, I decided to retrace my steps to the carpark. Then ahead of me in the shingle I could see a small flock of birds. On closer inspection, I could see snow and reed buntings, then amongst them there were the twite, which lightened my step walking back on the shingle beach.

Walking our dog along the Yare, I enjoyed the large flocks of lapwings being put up by several marsh harriers. Another flock of about a hundred waders took off in tight formation on the Cantley side of the river. It took me a few minutes to work out what they were, then the penny dropped, black tailed godwit. Over the years of living here I have only seen small numbers of this bird, so a flock of a hundred (ish) was really pleasing. This time it wasn't the marsh harriers putting them to fright, but a peregrine falcon.

Although only at the beginning of March as I write this, the dawn chorus is in full swing and we have observed blackbirds and sparrows collecting nest material from our garden. Winter visitors are still with us but will be moving north as the month progresses and our summer visitors will start to arrive. So, keep your senses alert, you never know what you might come across.

Gardening Notes

From the Allotment—Andrew Milner

You should now be planting out your potatoes, onions, and shallots. Potatoes need plenty of space, but this varies between earlies (new potatoes) and main crop so follow the instructions on the pack or check the spacings online if you saved your own seed potatoes. You can do this, but it obviously carries a bit more risk that they have a disease so check the tubers carefully before using. This shouldn't be a problem with newly bought seed potatoes but reject any that don't look healthy. If the potatoes are large, you can halve them before planting, making sure there are 'eyes'—new sprouting growth in both pieces.

The easiest and most reliable way to grow onions is from 'sets', which are small young bulbs. Double-check every few days at first and replant any that the birds have pulled out of the ground expecting a worm to eat! They need lots of water to get to a good size. Loddon Garden and DIY sell onion and shallot sets loose, which is less wasteful than the tiny bags garden centres mostly sell them in. There is less choice bulk-buying this way, but I have found them to be reliable varieties.

Aubergines, chillies and tomatoes need a long growing season to produce a good crop so April is the last chance to sow the seed. Lots of other seeds can also be started in the greenhouse or on the windowsill for the first sowings. Early radishes always seem to be the best.

From the Garden—Shirley Cross

This month is a busy time in the garden and the weather can still be a touch chilly for planting. Spring flowering shrubs, such as forsythia and flowering currant can be pruned now they have flowered and prune a third of your dogwood stems to retain the coloured stems. If you place the bright red stem tips from the prunings in water they may produce green shoots and roots so a few free plants and an attractive vase for the windowsill.



One job I always forget is to put my plant supports in now whilst the plant is small. It will grow through the support rather than me trying to squeeze it in later.

Continue to deadhead and feed bulbs and split large clumps of snowdrops, and keep well-watered. You may have seen the news about the yellow snowdrop, Golden Tears, that was sold recently for £1,850 for a single bulb, which beat the previous highest price of £1,390 in 2015 for Golden Fleece, another yellow snowdrop. Yellow marked snowdrops are highly desirable, it's a bit like tulip mania. These bulbs as they increase in numbers will become more affordable. Golden Fleece is now available for £130 a bulb.

Further news on the peat-based compost, I have seen several large supermarkets stocking Miracle gro peat-free compost so will try a bag and report back next month.

Our wildlife pond is finished so now off to plant water lilies and the bog garden.

Volunteering originally meant joining an army of your own freewill, rather than being conscripted. Fortunately, it has a less militaristic meaning today. But the notion of free will is still important. Those who volunteer, do so freely because they want to contribute to the community; to share their skills and experience with others; to give back something of the good fortune they have received.

But I worry whether volunteering is something which has had its day. I hear of clubs and societies folding because there is no-one prepared to step up and take on a role.
