Welcome to the King

National events are interesting. Some people think they're great, and that they bring unity and celebration, while others can't see what all the fuss is about. We have two national events on the horizon, both of them involving kings.

We're all aware that the coronation of King Charles III will take place on 6th May, amid much celebration and pageantry. The newly-crowned king will be a focal point for the nation because of the role passed on to him. We understand this whether or not we like having a monarchy. We're geared up for it, both locally and nationally.

The other national event comes in April, and because we're used to it happening each year, we could be in danger of forgetting its significance. It too involves acknowledging a king.



When Jesus arrived in Jerusalem, on the day we now call Palm Sunday, he didn't assume all the pomp and ceremony that will surround the coronation. Even so, the crowd recognised him as a king. Very soon after that, in a distressing turn of events, Jesus was put to a tortured death by the authorities who wanted to eliminate this "king". They wanted no possible competition for their power and authority.

If the story had ended there, we would not be celebrating Easter. We refer to Jesus as the King of kings because he did not conquer a nation by force, but rather he fulfilled the role God had set out for him. This was to be born as a human child and to grow up to demonstrate the extent of God's love for the world. He was raised from death in order to make it possible for everyone to have access to God's perfect love.

Amid the chocolates and Easter holidays this year, why not pause and consider who we are celebrating, and why we do it. Maybe you'd like to thank God for the King of kings this Easter, and join us for one of our services. They're listed on the centre pages.

Holy Communion is celebrated every Sunday at one or other of the Chet Valley Churches: either Book of Common Prayer (BCP) or Common Worship, with an informal Holy Communion service once a month in Chedgrave.



Coronation: Look out for coronation activities—more information soon.



Loddon and District Local History Group In January Will Fitch, warden at Wheatfen, gave us an interesting talk on 'A

very brief history of the Broads, Ted Ellis and Wheatfen Nature Reserve'. He explained how storms 2,000 years ago had formed the Great Estuary (Breydon Water is a remnant) with lots of wildlife arriving. Peat was dug out in the 11th and 12th centuries to be used as a fuel leaving large areas which filled with water resulting in the formation of Wheatfen and other broads. The reeds had been kept down by wild animals but once humans had wiped these out, they spread proving to be a good habitat for butterflies and bees. As a boy, Ted Ellis was fascinated by wildlife and learnt not to interfere, but to watch, observe and record. As curator for natural history at The Castle he was responsible for the dioramas that were set up. In 1946 Ted moved into Wheatfen which became a hive for naturalists including David Bellamy who became patron of the Ted Ellis Trust started in 1987. Ted wrote over 10.000 articles for the EDP as well as several books and often appeared on the BBC. Ted identified 10,000 individual species at Wheatfen including 1,600 fungi. Today it is famous for swallowtails, dragon flies and a rare beetle, unique to Wheatfen. The aim today is to allow Wheatfen to look natural but dykes are dredged to keep them open. flooding is controlled and trees are removed in a targeted fashion. Volunteers help to keep the scrub down and they do the mowing. As a result, many birds have been spotted including marsh harriers, kingfishers and bitterns. A new, higher boardwalk of composite plastic has been built recently. It should last for years. In 1985 Ted gave an interview where he said he hoped Wheatfen 'will go to someone who will look after it by not looking after it, as I have done.' Today, there are concerns about the effects of flooding due to climate change but new species like thistle aphids and Ambijopur proteus (wasps) have been found and many surveys are recording tide heights and peat accumulation. It is still a wonderful place to visit. The AGM was held at the start of the February meeting. Elvie then showed

us some of the maps from the archives. It was not until the 18th century that two maps of estates were produced. Mary Seaman's estate was surveyed by B. Reeve in 1755 and the Loddon Hall Farm Estate of Stephen Gardiner Junior in 1758.

Read Any Good Books Lately?

Rebecca by Daphne Du Maurier

I first read this when I was a teenager and I've re-read it throughout my life—it's a perfect springtime read! The unnamed heroine is on holiday in the South of France when she meets widower Maxim de Winter. Swept off her feet she marries him and returns with him to his home of Manderley in Cornwall—where the trouble starts.

It's a spooky, brilliant story, perfectly told with the feeling of the heroine being completely out of her depth, floundering around in the dark, and the awful shadow that the long-dead Rebecca casts.

Fleishman is in Trouble by Taffy Brodesser-Akner

I read this a while ago but have recently been watching the TV series on Disney (this is strictly 18+ mind you!) and have been reminded of how much I enjoyed the book. It's set in the heart of New York and tells the story of newly divorced Toby. He has joint custody of his two children, but then his ex-wife goes AWOL. What this book explores is the unravelling of a relationship/marriage and asks the question—how much of our relationships are skewed by our perspective and what we think we understand of the other person and our shared experiences?

The Rising Tide by Ann Cleeves

Nature Notes

April means that Spring should be well and truly with us. We have had a fair few spring-like days in February that has caused many of our resident birds to think about breeding. However, winter returned during the second week in March.

It has been encouraging to see Barn Owls regularly around Langley and Hardley. The same can't be said about Grey Partridges as all I've seen are the gaudy Red Legged Partridges which are released for shooting purposes. Brambling, a winter visiting finch, are also noticeable by their absence. This is only the second year we haven't had them visiting our bird feeders. Also seemingly absent this year, along the edges of the many dykes, are overwintering Green Sandpipers, a blackbird-sized wader.

I had heard that there were a flock of Snow Buntings, a Sparrow sized winter visitor, on the beach at Kessingland at the north end. So off we set and having walked around the pools there, apart from a few gulls, there seemed to be very little else. The dogs and I settled down to enjoy my lunch. I decided then to walk further southwards to see if I could find these elusive birds. They can blend into the sand and pebbles and become almost invisible. I hadn't walked far when I was suddenly aware of a group of small birds flying past me, the Snow Buntings had found me! At the same moment I became aware of nine small waders which had landed on the edge of the pool I was just passing. The colour and clockwork motion of eight of the birds quickly identified them as Sandling, the ninth was a lone Dunlin. I watched the Sandling as they fed around the feet of the roosting gulls for a while, before setting off to see if I could find the Snow Buntings and get better views of them. Fifty yards further south along the beach and there they were.

Trip number two was to Carlton Marsh on the edge of Lowestoft. This is a muchimproved site and well worth a visit. It is also dog-friendly which is an advantage. I wanted to introduce our young rescue dog to the fact that dog walks are sometimes accompanied by my scope and its tripod. I was hoping to see in particular an Eastern Yellow Wagtail, a bird that migrated west rather than south and ended up at Lowestoft. The second bird was a Water Pipit, which is the Alpine equivalent of our Rock Pipit, though very different. The trip was a great success;

dog and tripod didn't get entangled and I had very good views of both birds even enabling me to get recognisable photos using my phone and scope. There were plenty of other birds there giving good views. This day also ended on a high point as well. While I was picking up Rachel from work, a pair of Crossbills flew over.



Talking of birds flying over, this morning while at Seething I heard the sound of Bewick Swans and looking up there was a V-shaped flock of twenty plus birds. Then walking the dogs later around Hardley Street, scanning a recently dredged ditch, there was a Grey Wagtail feeding amongst the mud.

You never know what will turn up wherever you happen to be, so keep looking.

Gardening Notes

From the Allotment: As I write this at the beginning of March the weather is turning cold with frosts forecast. The soil had been warming up nicely and the beds were ready to plant my first and second early potatoes and my onions and shallots, but I will now wait for the soil to warm up again. It's also not great for germinating seeds even in my (unheated) greenhouse, so my windowsills are filling up with aubergines, tomatoes, chillies, peppers etc which need a long growing season. If you haven't got space to grow the seeds, then you can pick up good plants relatively cheaply as people sell their spares at the garden gate or at plant sales.

A dry winter/spring is not helping plants to get going and I have had to start watering my overwintering broad beans, garlic, lettuce, and spinach. Garlic needs water to swell the bulbs now. You can still plant garlic though it is better to plant at the end of autumn. After the last two dry winters, I planted additional garlic cloves this year to try and compensate for their smaller size. I am growing more broad bean seed in the greenhouse and adding this to the allotment as they are ready, and my final row will be beans planted straight into the ground to give a successional supply.

Everything should get going in April and with the warmer lighter days the plants will catch up on their own, but preparing and thinking ahead now is important.

From the Garden: We have experienced the driest spring for some years and forecasts are for another hot and dry summer, so we may need to plant more drought-tolerant plants. I will increase the lavender, rosemary and salvia plantings as these have fared very well against the deer; it might be that the aromatic plants aren't palatable to them. I will dig up my dahlias this month and see how they have fared over the winter. Hopefully I will also be able to take cuttings from the existing plants. They should be 5-7cm long, four or five to a pot placed in a warm spot and should root in three weeks. In future years I will store them over winter as this will be easier to increase my stocks and satisfy my curiosity over if they have survived. I will also try to increase my chrysanthemums as they provide a good show of colour in late autumn and add a new variety with purple flowers. Additions for the garden this year are peonies, Sarah Bernhardt and Shirley Temple, it says slug and rodent resistant but no mention of deer! I will keep a watch. Sarah Bernhardt is a pale pink and Shirley Temple is white. The blooms are very popular as a cut flower. I have tried growing them before without much success. They need a humus-rich soil in either sun or shade, plenty of moisture and I must remember to add the supports. Happy Gardening.
