Ministerial Musings

Christmas—A Sunday Special

Christmas Day is on a Sunday this year. It's the day that traditionally clergy like best as the week following it isn't punctuated by the need to provide normal services. We have a bit of down-time before we start again. But what are the implications of Christmas Day being on a Sunday? Is it special?

I always try to explain that Christmas is not really an event by itself, but it is the beginning of a story—the greatest story ever told. It's often difficult to see it as a beginning when the shops and media have been pushing tinsel and toys for weeks, and have generally been encouraging us to feel that by Boxing Day the game is over. However, just think about this:

- We know that Jesus was born in Bethlehem all those years ago.
 Both the Bible and other historical records show that this happened.
- We know that he lived in what we now call the Holy Land and spent his adult life teaching people about the love of God, and how they might be forgiven and reconciled to God in spite of the awful behaviour of many human beings.
- We know that he was killed by the authorities, and that he was not guilty of any crime.
- And finally, we know that the Christmas story doesn't end in death.

In fact, the Christmas story doesn't actually end. The birth of Jesus, just like everyone else, was the start of his life on earth, and of course we want to celebrate that. However, we miss the point if we don't also look ahead to Easter, when we celebrate both his death and his resurrection, which are the means by which we can know God's love and forgiveness. That is what we celebrate in church every Sunday.

So is it special that Christmas Day is on a Sunday? Yes it is, because we have two great celebrations—the birth of Jesus as a human baby, and the resurrection of Jesus as Saviour and Lord. Do come and celebrate with us in church on this very special day.

Holy Communion is celebrated every Sunday at one or other of the Chet Valley Churches, either Book of Common Prayer or Common Worship, with an informal Holy Communion service once a month in Chedgrave.



Services of Morning Worship are held in Loddon and Hardley.

XPRESSIONS (AFF is on the first Sunday every month at All Saints, Chedgrave. This is a relaxed and contemporary way of 'doing church'. Open between 10:00am and 12 noon, you can come and go as you please for coffee, cake, discussion, crafts, games, stories, reflection and much more.

All Together Worship is on the third Sunday every month at All Saints, Chedgrave, starting at 11:00am (January, March, June and September are followed by shared lunch).



A Snapshot of Life on the Farm in Sisland

The change of season brings a different routine. Work since harvest time has been varied, including spreading natural farm manure on the stubbles, trimming hedges, cultivating land and sowing seeds of winter wheat, winter barley and oil seed rape. Some artificial fertilizer and herbicides have been applied and with rain showers and warm sunshine throughout October the plants are growing well. This is also a time for maintenance work on machinery and farm buildings. After grazing on the meadows and marshes through the summer months, the cows with their one-year-old calves and the bull have been brought into the cattle sheds for the winter. They will be fed hay and silage and have a clean straw bedding every day. A few have already had their new-born calves and as the rest come near to calving, we will keep a close eye on their condition. It is always good to see a calf born safely. Wildlife such as Chinese water deer, muntjacs, hares, partridges and pheasants roam across the fields, swans spend time near the river, squirrels are busy storing nuts for winter and owls are heard calling. When the winter snow falls, it is fun to identify footprints and tracks left by animals and birds as they pass by.

Loddon Bell Ringers

Our members have been out and about ringing quarter peals at Cromer, Holt, Ashill, Great Ellingham, Barnham Broom, Upper Sheringham, Saham Toney, Watton, St. George Colgate in Norwich, and Wymondham Abbey.



On 9^{th} October we rang a peal of 42 doubles methods at All Saints, Woodton which took 2 hours 44 minutes to complete. We also took part in an Association trip to London on 22^{nd} October and rang the bells at four churches in the capital.

We are lucky in Norfolk to have a dedicated training centre at St. Peter Mancroft in Norwich. It was designed and installed in 2015 and houses eight simulated training bells, all linked to computers, so can be used at any time without disturbance outside. Daily courses are available tailored to an individual or group need ranging from introductory handling for beginners to complex method ringing for more advanced bands. During October it was open for people to see what the centre can provide, so we took a party from Holy Trinity to show our new recruits what additional training is available for them. It hosts regular junior ringers' sessions and is ideal for complete beginners of any age from across East Anglia and beyond.

As the year draws to a close, our bells will be rung for Sunday services as normal, for COP27, for Remembrance, the annual Victorian evening and all the services and events planned for the festive season leading up to Christmas. A Peal of Double Norwich Court Bob Major is planned for New Year's Day at Loddon which will start around 3:00pm and, if successful, should finish around 6:00pm.

This year we have found that, in general, the number of bellringers in our local area seems to have declined as we have been supporting more and more churches when ringers are needed. This may be covid-related as some of the older ringers didn't return afterwards, or due to having health problems or just moving away. Here at Loddon, over the last year, we were lucky to have some new recruits join us. They are of various ages and all are progressing well some starting to ring for Sunday morning services. As we are a teaching tower, we have good facilities to train new ringers. Loddon and District Local History Group

'Will Kemp and his Nine Daies Wonder' was the title of our October lecture given by Jonathan Hooton. He had researched the subject in detail and gave us some interesting visual material. Jonathan started by giving us some background material on Will Kemp's early life. He was probably born in 1549 which made him a contemporary of Shakespeare who was born in 1564. Kemp joined several performing groups and even travelled to the Low Countries in 1585, but the most significant company was Richard Tarlton's as he was the favourite actor of Queen Elizabeth I. Tarlton became famous for his quickfire wit and jests as well as the 'jig' which was a song and dance act at the end of a play. Tarlton died suddenly in 1589 and Kemp took on his mantle. In 1594 Kemp joined the Lord Chamberlain's Men who performed many of Shakespeare's plays. Their theatre was in Shoreditch but in 1598 it was dismantled and moved south of the Thames to be renamed 'The Globe'. Shortly after this move Kemp sold his shares in 'The Globe' and left the company. Jonathan speculated that Shakespeare may have criticised Kemp for not sticking to his script and, instead, ad-libbing to try and get laughs. Some support for this theory is based on the epilogue for Henry IV which Shakespeare changed so that Kemp acting as Falstaff did not speak at the end as he had expected to and then this character was omitted in Henry V's list of characters. Now unemployed, Kemp decided to 'Morrice' dance from London to Norwich in 1600. A good self-publicist he wrote a booklet about it, one of which is in the Bodleian Library. Kemp may have seen this as a way of making money through bets and selling merchandise like gloves. He had relatives living near Diss or he may have chosen Norwich as it was the second most important city in England at that time. Kemp started at the Guildhall in central London on February 11th followed by huge crowds. It took him nine days to actually dance the route but the trip was spread over 27 days so he could rest on some days as the dancing was very energetic and a test of stamina. The famous episode he is particularly remembered for is when he jumped over a wall at St John's Maddermarket to avoid the crowds which had gathered to see him. Norwich corporation gave him £5, made him a freeman of the city and promised him 40 shillings per year for life. After this Kemp joined other acting groups and may have died in 1605 from the plague.

How Winston Delivered Christmas Wish by Alex T Smith

With the focus heavily on American recording artists—notably Elvis, Little Richard, Willie Nelson and Sinatra—Dylan gets under the skin of each song. He also uses them as a jumping-off point to muse on eternal themes such as love, faith, growing old and passing beyond the veil.

Winter Stolstice by Rosamunde Pilcher

This is a book that I regularly re-read during the Christmas season. It tells the story of grief, loss and of people coming together and finding a way through. It darts about from London, to Cornwall, with the majority of the book set in Scotland. It's quite old-fashioned but there's something very comforting about Rosamunde Pilcher's writing and I think of this book as an old friend!

Someone buy me this for Christmas!

Bournville by Jonathan Coe—My favourite author for a wry, slightly despairing look on the world. His books are really enjoyable and this is 'a hugely impressive state-of-the-nation' tale. If you haven't read him before then try 'What a Carve Up' and 'The Rotter's Club' too.

Nature Notes

As I type this looking out of our kitchen window at the falling rain on the 3rd November, I wonder what the winter will hold for us.

I saw my first redwing on the 19th of September at Surlingham Church Broad. I thought I had seen some fly over but, as they had been silent and I only saw them in silhouette, I wasn't sure. I then came across a small group feeding in a hawthorn bush. But this paled into insignificance when I got home to discover that at Strumpshaw Fen they had a flock of about ten thousand go over! I saw my first fieldfare four days later, calling as they flew.

Walking the dogs at Hardley Staithe in September, I noticed something white along the edge of a field on the footpath going to Hardley Street. Thinking it was more than likely to be a discarded plastic bag, I did venture to scan it with my binoculars. I found that it was in fact a stoat standing on its hind legs showing its white belly. The dogs and I continued our walk crossing the footbridge and through the gate where we disturbed a male pheasant. The stoat reappeared and then ran off; I can only assume it had been stalking the bird and that we had scared off its dinner.

I have enjoyed the sight of the skeins of pink footed geese fly over, fascinated by the continually changing shapes and patterns of the flocks. There is the usual mobile flock of curlew around as well. I often see them in the field opposite the barns at Hardley Staithe. There also seem to be a good number of birds of prey around: buzzards, marsh harriers, kestrels and the occasional sparrowhawk. I think best of all are the red kite. A friend while walking at Hardley Staithe saw seven flying at the same time. The most I have seen is a family group of five.

Speaking of red kite, I was watching a couple of them at Hardley Staithe which were putting to flight a number of birds on the other side of the river Yare. I picked out what I thought might just be a pigeon. However, my binoculars let me see it had a long straight bill. It was too large and bulky for a common snipe, therefore, I can only assume it was a woodcock, which was a pleasant surprise as until then I hadn't seen one this year.

Taking the dogs to Whitlingham Broad where I had heard there was a slavonian grebe around, I wasn't disappointed as it was happily swimming with a group of coots. Also there, while watching a flock of long tailed tits fly in and out of a small hawthorn bush, I was able to see a very obliging goldcrest; a native British bird that is smaller than a Wren. That brings this year's bird species count to 192 so far!

On those crisp, blue sky winter days, why don't you wrap up warm and step outside to see what wildlife is out there for you to discover?

Gardening Notes

From the Allotment

As a change from hearing about my allotment in Chedgrave I asked a friend with an allotment by Loddon Mill to give me a summary of his year's experience given the very hot summer. "The growing conditions on our two sites are very different. The river and alluvial soil at Loddon Community Allotments tends to mean that there is moisture deep down at any time of year if the plant roots can access it. That said, my garlic crop failed*. I thought that they like the same growing conditions as onions but should have provided extra water. My soft fruit also failed, in part due to an attack of sawfly caterpillars, but the dry summer did not help. However, I had my best ever sweetcorn crop and had tomatoes coming out of my ears. Something always seems to do well and something always seems to do badly. Of course, as soon as the rains came, so did the weeds!"

*Garlic needs to be planted in November ideally and likes a wet winter and spring followed by heat to ripen. The last few years have been drier (and hotter) than normal leading to a poor crop. I have planted more garlic this year to compensate. Sadly, a recent Met Office long range farming forecast is for another dry winter along the eastern side of England and that there would be less moisture in the soil than usual come Spring. I'm thinking about what changes I can make to compensate.

From the Garden

As I write this it is very wet and windy, so it is a good time to plan the greenhouse plantings for next year. I have already decided to grow San Marzano tomatoes, I may try growing them outside and under glass. The cucumber plant given to me by a neighbour was interesting; it produced small round fruits. I checked on line and there is a cucumber that producers round fruit, *Crystal Apple*, a heritage variety with golf ball size prickly fruit with a sweet taste and no bitter after taste. I was looking forward to trying these but I will have to wait as the plant produced three very sweet melons!

The garden club challenge class for members next year is to grow a loofah, after watching Gardeners World and seeing the plants grown in Monty's greenhouse. We should get a few loofahs to give as Christmas presents next year. The chrysanthemum Fleur-de-lis I tried growing last year did not survive the winter, but a hardy variety, Innocence, did and it started flowering in November and has made a bush approximately a metre across with lots of pale pink flowers, Mrs Jessie Cooper is another hardy variety with bright pink flowers so I may add this to the border. I have taken salvia cuttings as they are not fully hardy and this will increase my stock and provide a few replacements if needed.
