Ministerial Musings

Dear all,

I am writing this on the I Ith day of Christmas (there is the sound of I I pipers piping in the background!). And to be honest, I was interrupted and didn't get back to it, so now I can hear 12 drummers drumming, as it is now the I2th and last day of Christmas.

I say this because so many times we hear people use the phrase: "All this for just one day", indicating that we have reduced Christmas to a one-day celebration. And our society seems to think that the I2 days of Christmas are *before* Christmas Day. There is a great confusion - coupled with the fact that I bought my first Cadbury's Creme Egg on the I6th December!!

One of the standard Christmas songs from my childhood is, "I wish it could be Christmas everyday", by Wizzard. I understand the sentiment. The song is now 50 years old and is an established part of Christmas TV and radio (and everything else out there).

One day, 12 days, Everyday? Which would be your preference? 2,000 years ago in the Near East birthdays were not celebrated, and we know Jesus wasn't born on the 25th December, but it is his "official birthday". Is that what we are celebrating - Just one day?

Is it right to have an extended 12 day festival? That could be exhausting every year and would exacerbate the loneliness and grief of those alone and bereaved at Christmas.

So how about Christmas everyday, in the sense that what God achieved in and through Jesus when He broke into history can have an eternal effect on us?

As The Message version of the Bible translates **John Iv14**, The word became flesh and blood and moved into the neighbourhood. That is what happened, and with Jesus in our neighbourhood, in our lives, we can have Christmas everyday - the joy of knowing God personally; of knowing that God hasn't abandoned us; of knowing that peace that the angels said would come with Jesus - the Prince of Peace.

I hope that is your experience, not just for one day, but for everyday.

News From Your Local Councillors



County Deal: Norfolk County Council has been offered the opportunity to have more powers and funding devolved down to it by central government. This would mean more decisions being taken locally over such things as investing in infrastructure and support for businesses. We would get £20 million pa for 30 years for this purpose (£600M). We would also take control of the Adult Education budget of £12 million pa so that a more local approach to training can be taken providing the right skills for our workforce. Further to this is a £7 million fund for redeveloping brownfield sites for housing.

If the council decide to take this offer, Norfolk will have to change the way the leader of the council is elected. Currently the leader is elected by the other councillors. Under devolution, the leader will be elected by the people of Norfolk in a separate election. Effectively, we would get a Mayor for Norfolk, similar to areas like London, Manchester, Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. NCC signed an 'in principle' deal last year. The last meeting was on I Ith January after the publication of Chet Contact, hence the limited update.



This is to minimise ground compaction and possible damage to the new surface which could in turn undo the benefit of the work carried out. Thank you for your co-operation in this matter.

St Felix Park Development Liaison Group: This is the new name of the group established by Cllr Phil Varney to try and secure the best outcome for the development and the village more widely. The group includes members of the public and council and has held two meetings as well as a meeting with Bennetts Housing. Phil has compiled a proposed response to the formal planning application which the council will be considering at its meeting on 11th January.

Christmas season, the buzz of activity around the Victorian Evening as well as the carol service where we enjoyed mince pies, mulled wine and the opportunity to chat. Glass update from All Saints, Chedgrave—January 2024

You may remember that in August last year the windows in the church at All Saints, Chedgrave were vandalised – "The worst damage to a mediaeval window that I have seen," said the glass conservator, Terry Devlin, about the East window. So what's been going on since then?

The East window was removed almost immediately and boarded up to prevent further damage or loss of glass. The plain windows that were also broken were removed some time later, and have now been repaired and replaced. That happened a little before Christmas.

We began fundraising in September to raise £38000 required to conserve the mediaeval glass after it has been repaired. We tried crowdfunding through our sister All Saints churches around the country and further afield. Astonishingly they have blessed us with just over £10000 towards our total, and we have been wrapped in prayer. In addition, some individuals have undertaken fundraising specifically for the glass (thanks to Kate and Hayley) and some individuals and businesses in the community have made donations. We were also fortunate to be awarded a grant from Norfolk Churches Trust of £7000. So we are now just over 60% of the way to the total that we require with ~£14000 still to find.

Please look out for our fundraising events during this year and support them. It will be wonderful if we can raise sufficient funds to return the glass to the window before the year is out.

Loddon and District Local History Group

The November talk was a talk with a difference. Georgette Vale took on the persona of Harriet Martineau and appeared dressed in a purple outfit and bonnet, fashionable in the nineteenth century. As Harriet she spoke about her life. Harriet was born in Norwich in 1802 but later on moved about the country and even visited the U.S.A. as well as countries in the Middle East. Her writing led to her becoming well known and she met a lot of famous people of the time including Wordsworth, Charlotte Brontë, Florence Nightingale and Coleridge.

Harriet's family were reasonably well off but her father lost money from his business and he left Harriet destitute when he died in 1824. On top of this Harriet had realised she was going deaf when she was 12 but by the age of 18 the condition had worsened. She decided not to ask people to repeat themselves but to rely on friends to give her essential information.

Harriet read widely about the social issues of the day and wanted to write about her views for newspapers and reviews. She also needed to earn her own living but it was not thought suitable for genteel women to write professionally so she referred to herself as 'V from Norwich' when she submitted her first articles and was pleased when they were accepted. Her writing career took off so she moved to London to be nearer to her publishers and started to write about important political issues of the day including the Corn Laws, the new Poor Laws, the need to abolish slavery and how to repress contagious diseases. She also wrote articles about religion including publishing 'letters between myself and Henry Atkinson on atheism' which outraged London. Her parents had been Dissenters but she had chosen to become a philosophical atheist. Harriet's pamphlet on 'Eastern Life' illustrated the origins of some of the old established faiths she had met on her travels in the Middle East. She became a successful social, economic and historical writer in her lifetime as well as writing 2 novels.

Unfortunately for Harriet she had several bouts of incapacitating illnesses including a 2 year bout in 1832-33 and another 5 year episode starting in 1839. She later moved to Ambleside in the Lake District and experimented with farming but a heart condition slowed her down for the last 20 years of her life. She died in 1876. She was a remarkable woman which her birthplace, Norwich, has acknowledged by naming Martineau Lane after her.

Read Any Good Books Lately?

Monkeewrench, by P.J. Tracy review by -Drew Bould - Angel Book Group

This thrilling novel was written by mother and daughter duo P.J. Tracy, revolving around Grace MacBride and her eccentric software development team who "... create a computer game where the killer is always caught, and the good guys always win." Their game soon becomes a nightmare, however, when fictional murders are replicated in real life and the team must come together to identify the murderer. There are plenty of twists and I was immediately hooked from start to finish. Diverse characters enrich the story making this thriller all the more enjoyable and, for those left wanting more, there are a further nine books in the series to date

Incredible Journey, by Sheila Burnsford review by Jacqui Richardson

This timeless classic narrates the difficult and brave journey taken by three pets towards the family they love, over harsh and dangerous terrain in Canada. The animals, Bodger, an old English Bull Terrier, Luath, a young Labrador, and Tao, a stoic Siamese cat are pets of the Hunter family who live in Northwestern Ontario. The family leave for England for a few months and there adored pets are left in the care of a man who then leaves for a two-week hunting trip, Luath urges the other two to take a journey towards their original home which is about 300 miles away.

Tomorrow and Tomorrow and Tomorrow, by Gabrielle Zevin

I think this must be my favourite book I read last year. It's an outstanding coming of age novel about friendship and heartbreak, set in the creative world of gaming. Sam and Sadie connect through video games at a very young age and become very successful at making their own games in later life, resulting in success, money and fame but it's not all plain sailing. A uniquely brilliant novel!

Wolf Hall, Bring up the Bodies and The Mirror and The Light, by Hilary Mantel

I listened to the audiobooks of these over the course of December and thoroughly enjoyed them. Mantel has such a gift for breathing life into history and making you feel like you're back in time with all the characters, and what a set of characters – Henry VIII, Anne Boleyn, Thomas Cromwell (not Oliver!) and so many more.

I want to read Murdle, by G T Karber

I love a puzzle and a detective series and this seems to have taken both elements and put them together. It's a series of puzzles which help you unlock clues to work out who is the murderer. I believe there is an online Murdle daily puzzle as well so if you get completely hooked you can continue!

So, you missed my wishing you all a happy Christmas and a blessed New Year plus a New Year's resolution, to enjoy our beautiful countryside or even watch what is about through a window. The list is endless and even if you don't know what you are looking at, just appreciate and enjoy it.

So now it's 2024. Recent mornings leaving home, we are serenaded by a Mistle Thrush high in the treetops. It's two phrases "Spring is coming, oh yes it is" is supposed to help you recognise its song, but I find I need quite a vivid imagination to match the two. It does encourage us on these wet and windy days that the harbinger of Spring is singing.

I remember that Pinkfoot Geese appeared around mid-October. I was in the garden early and heard and saw two small skeins fly over our home, one of 33 birds and the other of 22. Since then, they have been regularly grazing the marshes between Hardley and Hardley Street. Other times they to feed on the other side of the Yare, so I only get distant views of them flying. Out with the dogs last thing at night I hear them on occasions flying back to their roosts and wonder how so many birds manage to land close together in the dark without causing chaos.

On November 1st I saw a bird on the Yare I have never seen here. Normally they over-winter on the sea. As soon as I saw it, I knew it wasn't one of our usual Cormorants, it was a Diver and I realised it was the most common one, a Red throated Diver, but even so very rewarding so close to home. It was there for a couple of days. This year I've also seen its larger "cousin" the Great Northern Diver, a little further from home at Hamilton docks in Lowestoft. I had been unsuccessfully looking for Purple Sandpiper, a small over wintering wader, when a fellow birder told me about the Diver, so I went along and sure enough I had some great views of the bird. I'd seen 10 Purple Sandpiper at Ness Point the last week of 2023.

Although the weather has been wet and windy it has been mild and on two evening recently I have seen a Hedgehog. Also, along the Chet by Chedgrave Common I saw odd movement in the reeds and was enthralled to see an Otter slowly make its way down the river. Although you will be reading this in February, it's not too late to make a New Years resolution. Maybe even learning the songs of some of our garden birds, but whatever you decide, enjoy the beauty of what is around us and let it gladden your spirit even on the dull days. **Richard and Rachel Hull**

My avid reader gave me some helpful feedback on my last article which was about some new allotment holders unrealistically low expectations of time needed.

Firstly, I didn't say how much time, just "a lot more than you think"; so, to be more precise I think my plot of 250 m² takes me around 6-8 hours a week now its established. The time is not spread evenly across the year with more time in Spring and Autumn. It will be more when getting going on a new allotment and even more if you're a perfectionist, neat edges and straight rows! Plants don't seem to notice.

Secondly, that it wasn't helpful to novices, possibly even curmudgeonly! I'm as resistant as the next man to taking advice, but this made me think. I knew about gardening from my grandfather and father, but many people today may not have grown up with such ready examples or even gardens. My grandfather was wounded at Ypres and unable to go down the pit so worked in a tobacconist shop, which did not pay well. However, he had an early council house which typically had large gardens and was able to grow his own fruit and vegetables as an essential contribution to the household. Selling chrysanthemums helped with Christmas. It was such a treat to wander around the garden this morning to the sound of bells, a gang of Jackdaws and the high sweet notes of a robin and wren, particularly as it's rain free for a change. Luckily our garden is situated quite high up so it's not become swamped, I have had to regularly empty the drip trays containing my nursery plants to ensure they don't rot off.

There are but a handful of red berries left on the Holly tree and Pyracantha Coccinea growing up the wall of the shed, the Blackbirds have been feasting well.

I am filled with excitement to see that green bulb shoots are poking up all over the garden, there are even stems of Narcissus with their blooms still tightly encased. 2 yellow Crocus Specie are out and several of my fantastic Hellebores are blooming. When the first flowers arrive I don't much care what the weather throws at us, the magic has begun and there is no stopping it now!

Last week I pruned the blackcurrant bushes, removed some old woody stems, ensuring a nice 'vase' shape. I cut autumn fruiting raspberries right down and tidied up the gooseberries, removing about a third of the branches and ensuring there were no crossed stems. It's also time to prune apples and pears but avoid pruning cherry and plums in winter, they are prone to disease, wait until the summer.

On Behalf of The Trees.

As many of you may already be aware, I was once Tree Warden for Langley with Hardley, for a total of 22 years. Along with my friend Eric Wilkinson, warden for Chedgrave, I planted and cared for many trees in our parishes and also around the Loddon area. The Tree Warden Scheme, run by South Norfolk District Council under the guidance of Robin Taylor, seems sadly to have fallen apart over the past few years. As I understand, there are currently no tree wardens in Loddon, Chedgrave or Langley with Hardley, at the time of writing and consequently the trees in these areas have no one to speak for them. I am sure that, in these modern times, it cannot have escaped anyone's notice how important trees are to our survival. They are the bedrock on which we all depend for life and yet they too are now seriously under threat. Without them we would all die. Trees support all creation in a myriad of ways, too numerous to mention here and yet they still seem to be regarded with disdain. Across the English countryside they have been removed by their hundreds, in recent months, in order to build a new railway, which now seems to be under question as to whether it will be built or not. In our local areas too, I am witnessing trees being cut down just because they are considered to be 'in the way', with no regard as to the vital role they play. February is right in the middle of the planting season and everyone should be planting, not cutting down. If you could all plant just one tree each, this month, just think what a difference that could make. Of course, it is not just planting but also looking after them as they grow. Newly planted trees take time to establish whether they are bare rooted or pot grown. They need regular clearing around the base, ties and guards checked and eventually removed and sensitive pruning to shape them into a desired form for the future. Too often, as we have seen recently with the planting around the new Loddon roundabout, they are put in and just left with no thought of watering in the dry months or any of their other needs. This, as I am sure you have witnessed has resulted in many just giving up and dying. What a waste of time and effort not to mention the cost! So in this coming year I am urging you all not only to plant but to care a little more and if you notice a tree that you think needs attention, don't just ignore it. Contact the land owner and point it out to them or maybe, offer to look after it yourself, until it is mature enough to cope. Trees cannot speak for themselves so I am taking this opportunity to appeal to you all. Please don't ignore the fact that we desperately need trees and tell your children too as it is their lives that will depend on them in the future, along with all of the natural world. Thank you.
