

'Thank you for staying the course. Thank you for continuing to be faithful to the pledges you made 70 years ago. Thank you for showing us how service and faithfulness matter. People of all faiths and no faiths and people of goodwill can learn from this.'

Archbishop Stephen Cottrell, June 2022.

There are no prizes for guessing where that quotation comes from, or who it is about: throughout June Her Majesty the Queen has been at the centre of attention. Surely one of the most enduring images of the Jubilee weekend was the sight of her taking tea with a small bear from darkest Peru and it was oddly touching when Paddington Bear took off his iconic hat to thank her. You don't have to be any sort of Royalist to acknowledge that this is a person who deserves thanks, because she has been dutiful and faithful to the promises she made at the beginning of her life, throughout her very long life. In the words of St Paul, she has fought the good fight, she has finished the race, she has kept the faith.

It felt good, saying thank you at the Jubilee weekend, didn't it? Saying thank you to the Queen, of course, but also to the army of volunteers and the good will that led people to make things, donate things and give their time at the Jubilee fete. It was lovely to see our community get together and to see people enjoying themselves, after the long, cold winter of Covid: thank you, Loddon and Chedgrave Parish Councils. It was heart-warming, hearing about all the families who got together over the long weekend, seeing all of the smiles and happiness that actually being together brought about.

Perhaps one of the things that has come out of the pandemic is a sense of gratitude: gratitude for family and friends, for every bit of good weather and for our beautiful county. Gratitude expressed in those thank yous to the NHS, or to our fellow citizens as they carefully stepped away to keep a safe distance. To say thank you is to acknowledge the good things in life, it helps to make us happier. Dwelling on the bad stuff drags us down. Rejoicing in the good stuff buoys us up.

But what about the times when everything seems awful? What about the people of Bucha, as their city is destroyed around them? What about ourselves, when everything seems to be going wrong? Isn't saying thank you then just insincere, or silly? Well, St Paul advised the Christians of Thessaloniki to 'give thanks in all circumstances'.

This is a challenging and difficult time for many people, with the cost of living rising, a general feeling of insecurity and a war being fought on European soil. Looking for the things we are grateful for, every day, can change our mood and strengthen our mental health. Remembering to say thank you to every single person who does us a kindness can make them feel appreciated and valued. It's a small way to change the world, but it works.

You are welcome to join us at any of our services

Holy Communion is celebrated every Sunday at one or other of the Chet Valley Churches, either Book of Common Prayer or Common Worship, with an informal Holy Communion service once a month in Chedgrave.

Services of **Morning Worship** are held in Loddon and Hardley.

XPRESSIONS (AFÉ is on the first Sunday every month at All Saints, Chedgrave. This is a relaxed and contemporary way of 'doing church'. Open between 10:00am and 12 noon, you can come and go as you please for coffee, cake, discussion, crafts, games, stories, reflection and much more.

All Together Worship is on the third Sunday every month at All Saints, Chedgrave, starting at 11:00am (January, March, June and September are followed by shared lunch).

All Together Worship is designed to be as inclusive as possible: a mixture of formality and informality; traditional and modern; activity and stillness. In short, we will attempt to provide a service which will have points of connection for both children and adults—indeed people of all ages and all backgrounds.

Last Sunday Praise is held on the last Sunday of the month at St John's: a chance to sing old and new Christian songs and worship together.

XTRA! is an exciting, informal service every Thursday after school in St John's Church. Refreshments from 3:15pm, service starts at about 3:45pm. Open to all; particularly suited to children and young people.

The fete held on the playing field at the Jubilee Hall, Loddon was a roaring success, and it was lovely to see so many people having a fun day out. Thanks to all who came. I was pleased to be able to talk with many local people there and thank you for your suggestions on how the proceeds should be spent. I would really like to pay tribute to all the volunteers, who put in many hours to make this happen. Perhaps, if we do this again, we can encourage more people to join us. Many hands make light work.

The Staithe Footbridge: I am still awaiting some definite costings for the restoration of the footbridge. Like many others, the professionals we rely on to undertake this work, are incredibly busy. Be assured I will continue to pursue this project and will update you when I have some more news.

Norfolk Home Library Service

Norfolk home library expands service and calls for new users and volunteers.

Calling all book lovers and digital masters! A popular home library service delivered by Royal Voluntary Service and the Norfolk Library and Information Service is looking to expand throughout Norfolk.

A new digital inclusion program is also being trialled, in which specially trained volunteers teach the service's clients how to access critical information digitally, and how to download books online. The expansion means that the Home Library Service is looking to welcome new clients, volunteers, and Volunteer Coordinators to the team.

Volunteers work alongside their local library to select and deliver books and other media to those who may find it difficult to leave the house, have mobility issues, or caring responsibilities. The service also provides regular, friendly social contact to check if clients are safe and well, to discuss reading and listening preferences, and to report any concerns to appropriate services as needed.

Volunteer Coordinators liaise with local libraries, manage a network of local volunteers to arrange book deliveries, recruit new volunteers, and build relationships with local community groups to promote the service. As part of the new digital inclusion program, Digital Service Coordinators may offer their skills in workshops to train volunteers to use various devices, apps, and programs that the service's clients may find challenging.

Alicia Stillman, Service Manager for Royal Voluntary Service Norfolk Home Library Service says: "For people who find leaving their homes problematic, the Home Library Service offers a vital link to the local library and a welcome connection with a friendly face. The Covid-19 pandemic has shone a light on the significant number of vulnerable adults living in isolation. During the last two years, it has also become apparent that many socially isolated people were not able to access vital information due to digital illiteracy. Instruction on downloading eBooks, accessing GP and Council services, and setting up video conferencing can often be more easily explained in person, in an informal setting, one on one. Through the new digital inclusion program, with the help of our dedicated volunteers, we hope to bring clients back to the activities they love, prevent further isolation, and provide companionship and support."





Loddon and District Local History Group

Our May lecture was given by Dr Tom Williamson on 'The History of Orchards in Eastern Anglia.' The talk was based on a heritage project he had been involved in where research had been carried out on 10,000 orchard sites. Only 1,600 were still orchards.

He began by informing us that in 1871 orchards were mainly found in western England to produce cider. It had been difficult for that area to make beer as malting barley needs a lower rainfall than is found in the west. Eastern England had become arable over the centuries but there is evidence that some country houses in East Anglia made cider with ordinary apples and a commercial enterprise, that became Aspells' cider, was started in the eighteenth century near Stowmarket.

Dr Williamson outlined the different kinds of orchards that developed in East Anglia:

- Farmhouse orchards which looked nice in the spring and the surplus was sold. The land was also used for bee hives and as grazing for sheep. Quite a few survive;
- Commercial orchards where growing fruit trees was the main business. By the 1970s the use of sprays and weed killers meant the orchards were not looking that attractive;
- Garden orchards at country houses had become integrated into their garden design since the seventeenth century. Sometimes they were placed near the house for aesthetic reasons as at Somerleyton or in kitchen gardens like you can see at Holkham Hall and Houghton Hall;
- Orchards attached to big institutions like mental hospitals in the late nineteenth century, particularly in Herefordshire.

By 1900 there are thousands of orchards in East Anglia and the period 1850-1950 is viewed as the Orchard Century. Population growth and the spread of the railways meant more food was needed and could be transported around the country. By the end of the nineteenth century the continuing agricultural depression, caused by American imports of grain, resulted in the government setting up schemes for smallholders to grow more fruit. More and more commercial orchards were created and by 1960 the eastern counties became equally important to the western ones for growing apples.

A big decline followed as more profitable ways of using the land were developed and, in the 1960s, the government gave money for 'grubbing' out orchards. Fruit trees in East Anglia have been reduced by 84% in the last six decades.

Read Any Good Books Lately?

When the Sky Falls by Phil Earle

This children's novel was shortlisted for the 2022 Carnegie Medal. It's inspired by a true story of what happened to zoo animals in WWII, as the bombs started to rain down. Joseph is a young lad, charged with protecting Adonis the silverback gorilla, and to put an end to him if it all goes wrong. It's an emotional and exceptional book.

Birdcage Walk by Helen Dunmore

Set in Bristol at the time of the French Revolution, Lizzie is married to a property developer who has gambled on the market expanding, just as it begins to contract. Lizzie is from a family of radicals who thoroughly approve of the events happening across the channel while her husband views them with despair, and as the foreshadow of his changing fortunes. He also has a dark secret about the fate of his first wife and as Lizzie notices the change in his temperament, she begins to become fearful about his state of mind and intentions towards her.

The Eighth Detective by Alex Pavesi

This is such a clever book! I'm a big fan of the crime genre and this takes it to another level. There are murder mysteries within murder mysteries and the surprises keep on coming until the very end. The premise is that there are set rules to murder mysteries: there must be a victim; a suspect; a detective. The rest of it can be shuffled around to change it up and keep it interesting. Although it may sound complicated it's actually very easy to read and very much in the style of Agatha Christie with a modern twist!

The Giver of Stars by Jojo Moyes

Although Jojo Moyes is most famous for her books like Me Before You, I prefer her historical novels. Set in Depression-era America, Alice has married the handsome Bennett hoping to escape from her stifling life in England, only to be catapulted into an equally stifling small-town life in Kentucky. Her salvation comes from joining a group of women who are remote librarians, riding through the mountains delivering books to children and people who have no access to literacy. However, not everyone in the community welcomes their mission!

Nature Notes

As you read this, we will be halfway through 2022, though as I write it is still the beginning of June. We have blue tits nesting in the bird box we can see from our kitchen window, and I know that our sparrow nest box is also occupied. The common whitethroat that for the previous two springs has entertained us with its scratchy song has not returned this year. I finally caught up with a cuckoo on the I7th May as I drove along Cross Stone Street; it was flying over the fields. At the time of writing it is still the only one I have seen, though I have heard them regularly.

Rachel had one of those nature "wow" moments earlier in May when making her way to the car. She suddenly realised that there was a red kite flying overhead, gliding effortlessly. As I was following her, I was able to join in the experience. Then nearer the end of May while in Seething she had brilliant views of three grey partridges, two males and a female who were so caught up in their courtship duel that they were oblivious to her presence.

For me, going to Westleton Heath in the hope of hearing nightingales was one of the month's highlights. Although these summer visitors tend to sing at their best late evenings and early mornings, they are usually vocal during the day as well. I had walked along a footpath with high hedges either side and caught snatches of nightingales singing. On reaching the end of the path I had to decide whether to return to the car via the road or retrace my steps. I thankfully chose the latter. Before I had walked a few yards a nightingale started in melodious song. It was so loud that even my dog was stopped in his tracks and stared into the undergrowth. Suddenly I caught sight of slight movement and there was the bird singing its heart out, close enough I could have reached out and touched it, (which I didn't). An amazing experience to hear so many of these once common birds.

On the 18th May I had decided to go out birdwatching, either to Hickling Broad where there was a caspian tern or to RSPB Minsmere for a roseate tern. Before leaving I quickly checked what else was about and discovered that a white-tailed lapwing had turned up at Hickling, so my mind was made up. I was fortunate to see both the caspian tern and the white-tailed lapwing. The latter would normally be found in Iraq, Iran and Southern Russia, but this bird has been touring England for the last nine months, and I believe that Hickling is the furthest south it has come. Obviously, it was a first for me. In early June I did catch up with the roseate tern at Minsmere.

For anyone that is interested in learning more about wildlife, on the 30th July at Earsham Wetland Centre—their first free entry open day of 2022—called Wild Waveney. There will be more information about this event on their Facebook page.

As hopefully summer will bring with it warmer weather, make the most of it, get outside and take in all the beauty that is there. Nature, you know, is good for you!

Gardening Notes

From the Allotment—Andrew Milner

I confidently said in the June column that tender crops should be ok to plant out, only for a cold spell to hit around the Platinum Jubilee. I didn't lose anything, but it certainly set the squashes and courgettes back and I notice some people growing outdoor tomatoes took a hit. Goodness only knows what the weather will be like by the time you read this, but hopefully, you are all enjoying your fruit and veg harvest, busily picking and eating, freezing and preserving, particularly soft fruits like summer raspberries. It is well worth growing the autumn raspberry to keep this delicious fruit going as long as possible.

Once again, I had a poor crop of garlic as it was dry when it should have been wet and wet when it should have been dry. I guess the answer is plant more garlic bulbs to make up for their small size. New potatoes should be ready, and I start harvesting early when they are still young, tender and tasty. By the time they are finished the second earlies are ready. In my rotation leeks will go into the space left by the new potatoes. Also continue to plant successional crops and those vegetables that can be harvested in winter or will stand over it like leeks, kale or winter cabbage. There is still time to grow more beetroot, but I find as soon as it turns hot and no matter how much I water the spinach bolts.

From the Garden—Shirley Cross

The pond is finally full. When we had it dug in March we had no idea it wouldn't rain for weeks and weeks! The borders have been planted and although we have had deer, rabbits and a hare in the garden as yet the plants haven't been nibbled. I am still looking for a reliable peat free compost, some is just too woody and not all plants have thrived. A plant I am keen to add to the borders is Fuchsia Magellanica; it is a hardy bush growing to about two metres, happy in sun or partial shade. One variety has a local connection: Fuchsia Magellanica Lady Bacon with striking red, pink and purple flowers and small dark green leaves. Lady Priscilla Bacon was an avid collector of Fuchsias (and snowdrops) at Raveningham Hall. I haven't visited Raveningham Hall for a couple of years. Last time I came away with a large agapanthus and I know they usually have pelargoniums for sale so maybe time for another visit. The walled kitchen garden was also very impressive along with the stumpery (a 'rockery' of tree stumps).

July is the time to sit back and enjoy all your hard work in the garden and take notes for changes or new planting plans for next year. Local gardens open for charity are a good source of ideas and sometimes some unusual plants as the owners are often very keen gardeners. I hope to visit Wenhaston Grange this month, weather permitting of course.

Appeal for Nature

Sadly, even during the 'No Mow May' campaign, large areas of grass, in public places as well as local gardens, are being cut to within an inch of the soil. It seems that the urge to 'tidy up' and 'make things look nice' is still a mind-set of many living here in our villages. Those who do leave areas to allow existing wild plants to grow are seen to be messy, lazy and even disinterested in keeping the place 'neat'. Therefore, I would like to make an appeal, not for your money or even for your time, but just to see it in your heart to leave things to themselves, and make a difference.

I have visited many villages where this has now become somewhat of a feature among the inhabitants. Wild flowers are allowed to exist alongside other pollinator friendly plants and even verges and roundabouts have not been cut. Of course, I am still aware that some maintenance is required to allow access to certain areas and cutting of grasses and wildflowers needs to be done at the end of the season, after seeding, to allow for growth next year. Please do think about what you are doing.

If you are making a trip to North Norfolk this summer and would like to get a taste of what a wildlife garden can look like, you can do no better than to visit Natural Surroundings on the Bayfield Estate; a truly inspirational place. Do please take a look at what they have done to what was once an open field. I can assure you that you will be amazed.

There are two wildlife groups in this area both trying hard to promote more care for the environment: Chet Valley B-Line and the South Yare Wildlife Group (SYWG). They are working in conjunction with one another and are trying their best to educate the general public on this important matter but they need you! The SYWG is hosting an Activities Day for Wildlife on 21st August, in The Jubilee Hall, Loddon. Watch out for further details. They will have various displays from organisations who are trying to 'do their bit'. I hope you will come along to discuss with them your doubts and fears and to hear what they have to say.
