#### Ministerial Musings

This month we are celebrating the platinum jubilee of Queen Elizabeth the Second. There are all sorts of events planned including Trooping the Colour with a royal gun salute, a flypast to coincide with the balcony appearance of the royal family, the lighting of Jubilee beacons, a Service of Thanksgiving at St Paul's Cathedral, the Platinum Party at the Palace, the Platinum Jubilee Pageant and street parties up and down the country. It is good to celebrate the dedication with which Her Majesty has served the country, through good times and all manner of crises both national and personal, for 70 years.

We do like to gather to celebrate. As well as national events, we get together for family events joyful and sad. One of the sadnesses of the Covid lockdowns was that people were prevented from being together for life-events, particularly funerals when mourning and memories would have been shared. Now as restrictions have been lifted, there is a flurry of weddings that had been postponed not once but sometimes two or three times.

As a church we like to gather to celebrate too: our major festivals of Christmas and Easter; celebration of the land and its fruitfulness at Rogation (22<sup>nd</sup> May this year) and Harvest; Holy Communion. This month, coinciding with the Jubilee weekend, it is Pentecost.

What is Pentecost? It is the festival when Christians celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit, God's presence with us and within us. It is celebrated on the Sunday 50 days after Easter, hence the name. It is regarded as the birthday of the Christian church, and the start of the church's mission to the world.

Pentecost comes from a Jewish harvest festival called Shavuot. The disciples were in Jerusalem celebrating this festival when the Holy Spirit descended on them. It sounded like a very strong wind, and it looked like tongues of fire. The disciples found themselves speaking in foreign languages inspired by the Holy Spirit. At first some people thought that the disciples must be drunk. But one of them, Peter, told the crowd that the disciples were full of the Holy Spirit. And he went on boldly to explain all that had happened, telling them about Jesus's ministry, his miracles and teaching; about Jesus's wrongful arrest, trial and crucifixion; about his resurrection and return to God; about the promise of the Holy Spirit. Many people were persuaded then and in the following days, being baptised and joining a growing band who were 'following the way', a band who became known as Christians, followers of Christ.

On June 5<sup>th</sup> we will be celebrating Pentecost in our churches. Celebrating the fact that after 2000 years people are still being filled with the Holy Spirit, still joining the followers of the way, Christians. Why don't you come and join us?

#### **News From Your Local Councillors**





Ukraine I am very proud to report that our

District has been the most proactive in the county offering support to Ukrainian evacuees. So far we have taken in 215 guests, and I would like to thank the host families for their generosity to those who have much need of our support. If anyone is considering offering to become a host, contact the Help Hub at South Norfolk, who can provide information. By using the District Council we can ensure government funding for these displaced people and safeguarding for the vulnerable. The Staithe and Pyes Mill Moving on from achieving the funding for the footbridge, I have also managed to get further funding for more improvements at the Staithe and Pyes Mill. Local residents have been asking me if there was a safe way that we could provide public access to the river for small boats, kayaks and paddleboards. I have asked officers at South Norfolk to look into this as a project and hope we will be able to provide something like a pontoon or a slip way for this purpose. We are talking to the Broads Authority and will come forward with some options soon. Planning There are some unresolved planning applications still waiting to be determined, one that I am often contacted about is the proposed Beccles Road development. I know that many residents are anxious about these but can assure you that nothing has been decided. If you see activity on the land that is subject to the planning application, it will likely be investigation works and a requirement to be carried out before any decisions can be made.



in the Hales Assembly Hall, Briar Lane, Hales. Agendas are posted on the notice board in the brick bus shelter opposite Masala Garden and on our website 3 days before the meeting. Minutes are displayed in the same places.

Annual Parish Meeting was held on 10 May: Our thanks to Sir Nicholas Bacon who presented the villages with a Commemorative Plaque and gave a short talk. We had a Village Mardle about how residents see the village now and how they would like it to develop in the future. For more details of what happened look at our website for a meeting report or ask the Clerk for a copy of it.

Queen's Platinum Jubilee: At present, this event is proving a challenge to organise. The Parish Council do not have enough people to do everything that is required. It is difficult to find enough volunteers although we have had very generous offers from Martin Sisley, The Mod One to provide the entertainment, Brian Frost to provide electricity and Masala Garden for the refreshments. Please look at our website and the Facebook page (including Hales and Heckingham things) for up to date information about the event or get in touch with the Clerk.

Parish Council Role: The most important way the villages have a say in what South Norfolk and Norfolk Councils decide about Hales & Heckingham. It is unlikely we would have our roundabout, the improved playground facilities, the defibrillator, the A146 bus stops, the compost site, the speed awareness monitors or the village sign without a Parish Council. Developers would be freer to build properties in the village that residents do not feel provide the best solutions for the community. The Parish Council has been able to request conditions that occupants of new housing have better accommodation and amenities.

Parish Council Future: We are allocated seven councillors and currently have six. It is likely that three members of the Council will not stand for election next year and without more volunteers, there is a risk that Hales & Heckingham could lose its Parish Council. If you do not wish to see this happen please consider whether you would be interested in being involved in the Council. We would love to see projects such as a 20mph speed limit on School Lane and a new village hall which could accommodate more people and a wider range of events but these may not be achievable without a Parish Council. Any of the current councillors or the Clerk would be delighted to talk to you about how it all works.

Norfolk home library expands service and calls for new users and volunteers.

Calling all book lovers and digital masters! A popular home library service delivered by Royal Voluntary Service and the Norfolk Library and Information Service is looking to expand throughout Norfolk.

A new digital inclusion program is also being trialled, in which specially trained volunteers teach the service's clients how to access critical information digitally, and how to download books online. The expansion means that the Home Library Service is looking to welcome new clients, volunteers, and Volunteer Coordinators to the team.

Volunteers work alongside their local library to select and deliver books and other media to those who may find it difficult to leave the house, have mobility issues, or caring responsibilities. The service also provides regular, friendly social contact to check if clients are safe and well, to discuss reading and listening preferences, and to report any concerns to appropriate services as needed.

Volunteer Coordinators liaise with local libraries, manage a network of local volunteers to arrange book deliveries, recruit new volunteers, and build relationships with local community groups to promote the service. As part of the new digital inclusion program, Digital Service Coordinators may offer their skills in workshops to train volunteers to use various devices, apps, and programs that the service's clients may find challenging.

Alicia Stillman, Service Manager for Royal Voluntary Service Norfolk Home Library Service says: "For people who find leaving their homes problematic, the Home Library Service offers a vital link to the local library and a welcome connection with a friendly face. The Covid-19 pandemic has shone a light on the significant number of vulnerable adults living in isolation. During the last two years, it has also become apparent that many socially isolated people were not able to access vital information due to digital illiteracy. Instruction on downloading eBooks, accessing GP and Council services, and setting up video conferencing can often be more easily explained in person, in an informal setting, one on one. Through the new digital inclusion program, with the help of our dedicated volunteers, we hope to bring clients back to the activities they love, prevent further isolation, and provide companionship and support."



# **Loddon and District Local History Group**

Dr Richard Hoggett gave the April talk, titled 'A very remote period indeed. Discovering East Anglia's Earliest Humans.' Our area has some of the most important study sites for early humans in Northern Europe.

Around 700,000 B.P, after various ice ages when it had been too cold for human habitation, it become warmer so humans moved northwards. Secondly, our geography has changed. Around 900,000 B.P. Britain was connected to Northern Europe by a wide land bridge allowing people to enter southern and eastern areas of the U.K. East Anglia was particularly attractive for settlers as the River Thames entered the sea in North Norfolk and was a source of food and water. 6 important sites have been excavated:

- I. Hoxne in Norfolk. A hand axe was found in 1797 which was a 'threshold moment' in understanding human origins around 400,000 years ago and for a long time this was one of the oldest excavated sites. Discoveries there were found in brick pits deep in the ground which had been covered by an ice sheet later on.
- 2. Pakefield cliff erosion revealed flint tools dating back 700,000 years. A major dig took place here between 1971 to 1978.
- 3. Happisburgh is the most important site in this country for early signs of human life, finds again exposed by heavy erosion of the cliffs. In 2000 a hand axe was found, dating back 700,000 years and this sparked further investigations on the beach after a large bank of sand was created to keep the tide back. Flint tools, fossils, teeth from mammoths, fish and animal bones and hyaena poo are among the finds. From this evidence the team could reconstruct life in this area along the River Thames between 980,000 780,000 B.P. These have proved to be some of the earliest finds in Northern Europe. In 2013 a storm revealed an incredible find human footprints (2 adults and some children) in a peat bed. For 2 weeks the footprints were recorded and photographed until the sea washed them away, possibly the earliest example of human footprints outside Africa.
- 4. East Farm, Barnham in Breckland. Excavations around the ancient Bithin river revealed flint tools used 400,000 years ago and animal remains that are helping to reconstruct the climate of that time.
- 5. Beeches Pit, West Stowe which is a former gravel pit. The orange earth there suggested a deliberate fire had been made.
- 6. Lynford Quarry saw a very deep excavation of this Neanderthal site dating back to 65,000 years B.P. There was evidence of butchery of mammoths there. These sites prove that East Anglia is at the forefront of the discoveries of early humans particularly at Pakefield and Happisburgh but the story is constantly changing. A fascinating lecture.

On June 10th there is an outing to Raveningham Gardens instead of a lecture. July 20th Phyllida Scrivens: The Great Thorpe Railway Disaster of 1874. All meetings held in St John's Lecture Hall, George Lane, Loddon starting at 1:30pm. Admission £3.

### The Queen's Knickers by Nicholas Allen

A very funny royal tale of the many important knickers the Queen wears for different occasions (woollen for Balmoral, ones with holly on at Christmas – that's why her message is always rather short!). What knickers will she wear for her Platinum Jubilee one wonders?!

### Mr Wilder & Me by Jonathan Coe

From one of my favourite authors, it's a bit of a departure from his usual stories and feels like a love letter to the golden age of film. I found it compelling and a lovely easy read. It tells the story of Calista, who falls into working in the film industry after she meets Billy Wilder, revered director of Some Like it Hot etc. It flits between Calista's present-day life and her memories of working with Billy. There are some very intuitive touches about changes of fortune and how stars rise and wane. It's bittersweet with very likeable characters.

### **American Dirt by Jeanine Cummins**

I was given this by a friend who said she couldn't put it down. And I felt exactly the same – I read it in two sittings! It's the story of Lydia and her son Luca who, after their entire family is gunned down at a family BBQ, in their home-town of Acapulco, have to flee. The insidious influence of the cartel responsible for their loss are long reaching and they are forced to become migrants, treading a well-worn path through Mexico and to 'El Norte' (the USA). The book has been a controversial one in that some people have argued that it's not the author's story to tell. But I don't know much about the plight of the Mexican migrants and the journey they undertake, and this book has definitely made me more likely to seek out real-life experiences and opened my eyes to how horrific it can be. It's not a perfect book, but it's a very readable one, and the small acts of human kindness that are noted along the way feel very real and heart-warming.

### Daisy Jones and the Six by Taylor Jenkins Reid

A tale of a band that rocket to stardom in the 70s – loosely based on the Fleetwood Mac. It's told using interview transcripts of band members and various friends and family, it makes it feel very immediate and real. And you get particular insights into each relationship, which you wouldn't do if it was told as a traditional story. I inhaled this book! It's a wonderful read. A Place of Greater Safety by Hilary Mantel I was hoping to read this in time to review it but it's a large tome! I'm now saving it for the holidays. It focuses on the families and the loves of the men who led the French Revolution – Danton, Robespierre and Desmoulins.

### **Nature Notes**

I sit typing Junes Nature Notes watching the much-needed rain fall, I thankf my dog who decided to shorten our walk, it enabled us to be home before the rain set in. We had been walking at Rockland Broad enjoying the early afternoon bird song serenading us. Willow Warblers cascading song and Chiff Chaffs calling, the fluting song of Blackcap, and approaching the reeds, both Reed and Sedge Warblers were singing interspersed with the angry call of Cettis Warblers. There was little bird life on the broad except for a few pairs of Great Crested Grebes. However, flying over a small mixed flock of Artic and Common Terns were active, diving for small fish. At this point our dog decided it was time for home, almost back at the carpark a Kingfisher showed itself as it flew off the Staithe and then surprisingly up the road! During the last week of April, working at Seething, each morning I've been entertained by up to 6 Ring Ouzels, passing through on migration to breeding grounds on moors and mountain areas. There have been good numbers of them passing through here in May. Including 21 birds seen at Waxham one morning. Along with Ring Ouzels I also had good views of a Wheatear, but it only stayed around for a day. This morning, as I arrived in Seething, I was pleasantly greeted with the sight and sound of two Grey Partridges, which are always a delight to see as this native species are becoming rarer. The gawdy Red Legged Partridge which seem to be everywhere, are game birds that are raised and released for shooting. We are still waiting to see and hear the classical sound of summer which Swifts are responsible for. Saying that, there does seem to be only low numbers of Swallows, House Martins and Sand Martins about. I have seen all three species but only in very small numbers. Nor have either of us seen or heard a cuckoo. However, the Garganey, a small migratory duck seemed to have appeared in far greater numbers than normal. I watched some at Carlton Marsh, they are beautiful birds especially the males with their white crescent over the eye extending down their neck. A couple of days have past since I started these notes, and we are now sweltering in a mini heatwave. We have enjoyed seeing more butterflies about including Holly blue and Orange Tip. Around the marshes dragonflies are beginning to emerge, though as yet I have failed to identify any, I have definitely become rusty with my identification skills. Roadside verges are awash with white cow parsley and the hawthorn hedges are bursting into flower. Trees are draped in their green finery though some species, like Sycamore, Oak and Ash seem to be reluctant to adorn themselves in their green dresses. Though by the time this goes to print and lands on your door mat they will be adorned in all their green finery. We are fortunate that we live in such a beautiful county. So, get out or look out of your window and Richard and Rachel Hull enjoy.

### **Gardening Notes**

### From the Allotment—Andrew Milner

June is a productive month and we should all be enjoying picking and eating (freezing, bottling etc) the results of our hard work. It should be safe to plant out all more tender plants like courgettes and squashes now. You should also be successional sowing to ensure food is available in a continuous flow to avoid gluts. Easier said than done I know and it's tempting to simply to put all the seeds out at once, but worth the effort. Some veg like beans just taste better freshly picked.

As the avid reader of this column knows I like to experiment and for the last few years have mastered growing sweet potatoes. This year I decided that the cost of the slips + my time compared to the price in the supermarket simply doesn't make this worthwhile, though they do taste better.

Thinking along these lines my advice on the best things to grow that more than repay the effort are soft fruits. Expensive in shops and easy to freeze also relatively simple to grow and if you have little space many grow upwards which maximises the use of space, even gooseberries can be trained espalier. The fruit you grow may not be so perfect as the supermarket ones, but they taste wonderful. And if you are organic, you know exactly what they have been sprayed with. Nothing!

My experiment this year is with mushrooms. More on this later....

### My Memories of when Bombs fell on Hardley and Langley

Some people moving into Hardley and Langley are surprised to hear that bombs were dropped in the area during World War 2.

The first instance I remember was when two bombs were dropped on a Friday night. The press reported that these were the first to drop on English soil, but we later discovered that Yorkshire beat us to it.

The only casualty was a little pony on the marshes.

Later a bomb was dropped on Hazelmere Wood and this was thought to have been a land mine

Worse followed when a number of bombs were dropped around the same time. A council house was set on fire. I cycled round to see and realised it was one my family had previously lived in.

The nearby fields were littered with incendiaries, most of them live, but the real surprise came the following morning when I saw my mother looking into a hole in the ground near our home where an unexploded bomb lay. All the families around had to move out for several days while the bomb squad defused it and took it away. I had to leave my dog behind which meant I was up early each morning to cycle over and feed and walk him.

We discovered that Mr Soanes had been killed cycling home the night the bombs fell. It literally hit him on his bike. He had been at work at Cantley and had stopped at the pub with others after crossing the river by boat as usual before leaving to set off home. If he had stayed a while longer or left earlier he would have been in the clear.

We would roam around the fields and marshes and find hundreds of incendiaries, I wonder if some are still there today?

A young soldier at the time said the army were setting up ack-ack guns around Norwich and the Germans may have been trying to disrupt the work. Possibly unable to find a target they dumped their load as they left for the coast and home.
