Ministerial Musings

Did you watch the coronation? I wonder which part you liked best.

I wonder what you thought about the secret bit, where they put screens around the king so nobody could see what was happening? Did you hear the words which were sung while this part was going on?

Zadok the priest and Nathan the prophet anointed Solomon king.

And all the people rejoiced and said, "Long live the king!"

They were pouring oil on King Charles's head. But why? And what does Solomon have to do with this?

Anointing—pouring oil on someone's head—was used in ancient Israel to set the high priest aside for God's purpose and was later done to set people aside as kings; the first of whom was Saul, about 3000 years ago. After Saul came David and then his son Solomon, who was anointed by the high priest Zadok and the prophet Nathan.

When Saul was anointed by the prophet Samuel, God's Holy Spirit descended on him and he began to prophesy, something which he had never done before. So, for thousands of years, anointing with oil has been associated with the spirit of God. And the anointing of King Charles III was just the latest in this long tradition.

We also use anointing at other times: for instance, when someone is baptised or confirmed or ordained as a priest. In all of these instances, the oil is symbolic of the Holy Spirit, whose coming to the early Christians we celebrate at Pentecost (or Whitsun) on 28th May this year, fifty days after Easter.

One of the things about God's Holy Spirit is that it is unpredictable; if you ask the Holy Spirit for inspiration you never know quite how it will turn out. Sometimes the Holy Spirit might turn up unannounced; just ask me how I started my journey back to faith!

Have you ever wondered about faith; about God; about Jesus? Perhaps you've dismissed it but still have a nagging little feeling that there might be something more? My challenge to you is to ask for the Holy Spirit to come and see where that might take you.

Happy Pentecost!




Neighbourhood Plan: There will be 2 consultation events, a chance to hear more about the plan, view the policies and speak to those involved in developing it.

Loddon and District Local History Group

Rowena Burgess gave us an informative and interesting talk in April about 'The Evolution of Education in Norfolk'. She started by explaining how literacy rates were assessed in the nineteenth century using marriage registers. In the 1780's 68% of men but only 39% of women could sign their name on the register and hence were seen as literate. By the end of the nineteenth century literacy rates had reached nearly 100% and Rowena proceeded to outline the reasons for the change.

Almost all agreed at the start of the 19th century on deficiencies in existing schools. Basic education offered was of poor quality with superficial learning and for the rich too much attention was given to ornamental accomplishments. Many believed the poor should not be educated above their station, others debated educating girls.

As the nineteenth century began, education was not compulsory, there were few schools apart from, Dame schools offering limited education to the poor; charity schools, often run by the churches, who believed education would prevent ignorance, vice and debauchery; Ragged schools started by Robert Raikes for working children to attend on Sunday; Sunday schools run by churches and grammar schools for middle class boys. Some of these types of schools increased during the century so that by 1851 three quarters of working class children received some kind of education even though it might just be on a Sunday. Teaching reading was priority, not writing skills ,so that children could access the Bible.

In 1833 the government began annual grants to both the Church of England and the Dissenters to help develop schools but government inspections were also introduced. As there were few qualified teachers the Monitorial system was introduced where older pupils taught small groups within a large class. In 1870 the Education Act created the first state system of elementary schools, creating School Boards to provide schools where churches were not providing enough places. In 1880 education was made compulsory up to the age of 10 and in 1891 it became free. A dual system developed where non denominational board schools received government money and operated alongside church schools which survived on grants and subscriptions. Many of these church schools are still in existence today.

Debates continued. Instruction for all included moral and religious teaching as well as social discipline. Writing was still not seen as an important skill while girls often had a limited education. More education acts were to follow in the next century.

Our Wives Under the Sea by Julia Armfield

This is a haunting horror story of love, with parts of it feeling almost hallucinatory. It tells the story of Leah and Miri, a married couple who have been reunited after Leah's return from a submarine exercise that went wrong. I finished this book slightly reeling from the absolute heartwrenching sense of impotence and loss that Leah goes through. It's also the type of tale that leaves almost as many questions as it answers. It would be perfect for a book club – I imagine many animated discussions!

The Last Thing He Told Me by Laura Dave

Hannah is an artist who has recently married and gained, along with her husband, a teenage stepdaughter, Bailey. When her husband disappears and everything that they'd previously known about him turns out to be a lie they uncover a very different person, and history, to the one they both thought they knew. It's a great depiction of a dysfunctional step-daughter/mother relationship, which is strengthened by their desire to find out the truth, even when thwarted by everyone along the way. This fast-paced story is a fun mystery, although I did think there were a few details missing at times!

Around the World in 80 Trains by Monisha Rajesh

I would love to do this! It's the account of her and her partner's adventures circumventing the globe in eighty train journeys. From travelling through Russia and down to China on the Trans-Mongolian express to the bullet trains of Japan, even venturing into North Korea, it's a refreshing account of people, places and hours spent on trains.

I am hoping to read...Winnie and Nelson by Jonny Steinberg

Although Nelson Mandela's life has been explored by a prolific number of biographers and historians the story of his marriage to Winne has largely been untold. It is 'an empathetic portrait of one of the most controversial power couples in history.'

Nature Notes
It is June, flaming or otherwise, always plenty to stimulate our senses. I'm writing in early May, overcast with showers but walking round Hardley Staithe and the Yare this morning, I saw my first Swifts plus a Kingfisher carrying a fish, presumably back to its nest hole. Rachel saw her first swift on the last day of April.

There seem fewer butterflies around this year. We've seen a couple of Brimstones, a few Peacocks, Commas, Green Veined, Tortoiseshell and Holly Blue, Rachel has also seen Orange Tips. Cold April winds may be the cause.

The dawn chorus is interesting, each day may have different birds singing. For example, today, no Chaffinches singing early on, Other days Robins or Song Thrushes silent, I don't know why, other than possibly temperature and wind strength.

I made a bad choice a month ago. At lunch time, I heard that two Night Herons were at Lound Lakes. It is a Suffolk Wildlife Trust reserve between Loddon and Great Yarmouth. They are usually in southern Europe, but several turned up around the UK. I'd never seen one bthey ut decided not to rush, they would be bound to be around for a few days. Big mistake, had disappeared by the next day.

Overall, though an interesting month. Early in April I was at Hardley Staithe and noticed a bird of prey over the fields. I lost it but found it again flying towards Hardley church. I had a clear view of a banded tail, confirming it to be a female Hen Harrier, brilliant. It got even more exciting as I was walked along the bank the Yare. A Merlin flew almost straight at me chasing a small Jack Snipe. I was privileged to watch this for ages as the two birds were locked into a one-sided ariel battle. It was breathtaking watching the story unfold as finally the Snipe managed to lose its pursuer. Another walk found a couple of Wheatears in the same area as they pass through to their moorland breeding areas

Another day in Hardley Street by the muddy dyke I have mentioned before, a Stoat was playing hide and seek with me. Often posing on its back legs, great for a photo but unfortunately with two dogs on leads wanting to join in the fun and games, prevented me from optimising this opportunity.

Other highlights of April were a Yellow Wagtail in Hardley Street, once common here, this was the first one for some years. Then walking from Hardley Church to the Chet, a Grasshopper Warbler singing. I couldn't see it as they tend to sing well hidden in bushes, but whilst searching for it a Cuckoo flew through I finally caught up with a Little Owl on the way to Seething but still no sign of Grey Partridges.

Gardening Notes

From the Allotment

It's early May and it is mild and wet, it should encourage plants to grow after a slow start. It also means hoeing as 'weeds' will grow too. If you have suitable mulch apply it wherever you can to reduce hoeing and hold in moisture. Important on my sandy soil. I plant through weed suppressing fabric where I can, e.g. brassicas, and also use cardboard, wood chip, grass cuttings and straw as mulches.

For strawberries I use weed suppressing fabric **and** straw— one to suppress weeds, the other to stop strawberries sitting in damp. I have replanted my strawberry bed with drought resistant varieties as 90% died last year in the drought and run a weeping hose through the bed in case the same happens again. I will also be ready to shade it. Too much sun can also damage raspberries causing white drupelet - the small individual fruits forming aggregate fruits like blackberry and raspberry.

Frost danger is just about gone so time to get on with planting out what you have been bringing on in a seed bed or greenhouse like courgettes, pumpkins and squash.

If you still have over-wintered leeks, finish these now, even small ones go to seed. May is really the last chance to sow parsnips and main crop peas.
