Ministerial Musings

How do you react to an appliance crisis? When I lived in London the person in the flat above used the 'let's hope it's not happening' strategy—bad news for me when her washing machine went wrong.

For most of us the pandemic was our first encounter with a world-changing crisis, but looming large on the horizon comes an even greater threat: the climate emergency. The predictions for this planet at its present level of CO_2 emissions are dire and we have already seen the effects in our own gardens and fields around us. We're in this together: there is no Planet B.

This month Boris Johnson and 190 other world leaders will meet in Glasgow for COP26 with the main focus to limit global warming to 1.5° and to ensure that money—big money—is set aside to tackle it. It is easy to think of this as something we can either ignore or wring our hands over, but which we need not participate in. But it is when ordinary people get involved that real change happens—when we write to Boris Johnson supporting what he said at the UN on climate change, as a dozen of us did in Chedgrave last month, when we pledge to reduce our car use, or to turn our heating down a degree, or switch to green energy.

The Bishop of Norwich is the lead Bishop for the Environment in the Church of England and will be at COP26. Why not write to him and our MP, Richard Bacon, telling them how you plan to make a change for the sake of the planet? There is still time to change and every bit of action helps.

In the book of Jeremiah God tells his people: 'I brought you into a plentiful land to eat its fruit and enjoy its good things. But you came and defiled my land and you made my inheritance repulsive.'

What might such a prophet say to us?

Can you look the children of the Chet Valley in the eye and tell them you are pretending this crisis isn't happening?



Loddon George Lane and A146 junction roundabout:

Part of George Lane is to be closed in the next phase of the roundabout construction. This will be from Kittens Lane to the A146. George Lane will be made one way into Loddon for the duration of these works which could take up to 7 weeks. This should start around the October half term.

Permissive Path Loddon Marina to Pyes Mill:

I am pleased to report that the landowner has now reopened the footpath, we are very grateful to him for restoring this popular route. The bridge to Pyes Mill has also been mended by South Norfolk Council. Please respect this private property and keep your dogs on a lead, so that all may continue to enjoy this facility, whilst protecting the wildlife.

Flooding:

I have been made aware of various places that have flooded during the heavy rainfall recently. I have spoken with my highways engineer about the drainage in these places and he is arranging for the gullies to be cleared. If you know of any others that need attention, please let me know.







We are two very small co-joined villages of fewer than 200 homes. A well-established parish council provides a focus for the community to identify concerns and projects and endeavour to solve them locally themselves. The council consists of a chair, a clerk and six councillors who meet bi-monthly to manage a wide range of local issues including planning applications, play area, the safety of trees and any issues brought up by members of the community. We also monitor traffic speed at four locations in our area through the deployment of a speed camera sign which we share with Claxton on a three-month rolling basis.

Councillors represent the voice of the whole community, whilst being aware of and considerate to, specific minority needs.

We currently have two councillor vacancies for which full training will be given.

One of these will take responsibility for the play area—this involves regular checks on the equipment and the general state of the play area. We are very fortunate to have this facility and it needs to be kept in good condition to ensure that our children are safe as they play. If you have young children who enjoy the play area perhaps you could consider volunteering for this role.

We would like to develop a social media presence in the villages but we don't have the skills to even know where to begin! Could you help? The person filling the second vacancy would focus on this project, formulating a plan and explaining to the parish council how it could be implemented and then to monitor the project.

The council has a very moderate budget income which is called a precept. This is collected by South Norfolk Council on our behalf through the council tax—this year we have approximately £7,500 to do all we do. A high proportion of our income is spent on grass and hedge cutting at the village hall and play area and paying for the part time support of a professional clerk.

We are keen to hear from our residents on ideas to improve our community involvement.

Notes from Sisland

As we enter the autumn season, the weather definitely changeable, our attention turns to a period of reflection and remembrance. For those who know Sisland church you will be aware that there is no war memorial in either the building or the churchyard. However, there are a few connections to both world wars, some of which are commemorated on the gravestones.

In the churchyard and close to the east end of the church is the grave of Catherine Kiddle. The Kiddle family lived at Washingford Farm at the start of the



twentieth century. One of her sons, George Alfred, died on 22nd March 1916, aged 21, from war wounds at a field hospital in Belgium. He is commemorated on the memorial at Lijssenthoek Military Cemetery in Belgium. He is also commemorated on Catherine's gravestone as she had died a few months earlier. Presumably when Joseph, her husband died, there was not room for an inscription on the gravestone, but we assume he is buried there. George would have been a recognised figure in the village.

At the west end of the churchyard there is a gravestone for Teresa Fairhead and marked on it as well is her son Sgt/Pilot Edward Eaglen. He was killed on the 5th February 1943, aged 23, and buried in Tripoli War Cemetery in North Africa. Not a resident of the parish but commemorated here.

Also, on the Commonwealth War Grave Commission website, I noted that Flying Officer Frank Joseph Plant is commemorated at the Norwich cemetery on Earlham Road. As my brother cares for some of the Commonwealth war grave sites in Norfolk and Suffolk, I sent him on a mission to find that stone. Frank Plant was the son of Frederick Joseph and Edith Ellen Plant, of Sisland. He died on 19th February 1945, in an accident near RAF Zeals, which is north of the village of Zeals in Wiltshire and next to the Stourhead estate. The site of the crash, which killed 20 men, is marked by a memorial, which was erected by the Wiltshire Historical Military Society at Beech Clump.

The connections can be widespread and the three above are only a starting point. Sisland Church will continue to be open during the autumn, even if the door is closed it will be unlocked, so please take the opportunity to visit us if passing.



Read Any Good Books Lately?

How to Kill Your Family by Bella Mackie

Meet Grace Bernard: daughter, sister, colleague, friend ... serial killer. Grace loses everything when her mother dies and she finds out her estranged father is a multi-millionaire. She plans her revenge which is: kill her family, make a claim on their fortune, get away with the above, and then perhaps adopt a dog.

All at once funny, serious and strangely uplifting; this book is hilarious and dark. It's not often you are on the side of a serial killer, but this book has you wondering whether you are in fact on Grace's team as she goes about her plan to dispatch every last family member until she's the only one left.

A gripping read, How to Kill Your family is certainly a page turner, but I advise reading it with tongue firmly in cheek.

Hamnet by Maggie O'Farrell

Set in Stratford, England, in the late 16th century, Hamnet imagines the emotional, domestic, and artistic repercussions after Will, a playwright, and his wife lose their only son, I I-year-old Hamnet, to the bubonic plague in 1596. Four years later, the boy's father writes his grief into a play—titled with another spelling of his son's name—in which the father dies and the son lives to avenge him.

Hamnet is a beautiful book; grappling with the stages of grief and its effect on brothers and sisters, mothers and fathers, and husbands and wives. The scene is beautifully set, much like the playwright's works; you become deeply involved with the characters. As such, although wonderful, this novel was, to some extent, an emotionally exhausting read. However, this would not be a reason to discard the thought of reading it. Hamnet reverberates through time and tide, and its message is wholeheartedly applicable to an age combatting against our own pandemics.

Buzz is a surprisingly interesting book which I found difficult to put down. Written by someone who became a self-confessed bee nerd it is a natural and cultural history of bees that begins I25 million years ago when a wasp first dared to feed pollen to its young.

Nature Notes

It's a blustery, cold, wet Saturday afternoon at the beginning of October so what better time to write November's Nature Notes.

I had hoped that September would have been more productive for me birdwatching, but that wasn't the case. Early in the month while there was an easterly wind blowing, I took our dog to Winterton to check if any rarer birds had blown in on their flight south. After scanning the sea for some time with my scope, all I could find was a solitary cormorant, not what I had hoped for. While sharing my lunch with the dog, I did manage to see a small number of gannets flying by. The pure white adult birds, with black wing tips, shine out in the sun unlike their dirty grey looking juveniles. None of the birds I watched were fishing. This can look spectacular as they dive from height with folded back wings. Walking back to the carpark through the dunes I did see a solitary wheatear. Although disappointed not to see a greater variety of birds it was still a beautiful day.

Near the beginning of the month as dusk enveloped its cloak, I went out into the garden, when a sudden movement caught my eye. Initially I thought rat! However, as it made a scratchy sound as it went under our side gate, I realised that it was an adult hedgehog and the noise was the spines scraping the underside of the gate. I was pleased to discover that we had at least one visiting the garden. Since then, I have noticed their droppings on several occasions. Another mammal that I saw, this time walking the dog along the Yare between Langley Dyke and the sugar beet factory, was an otter. I saw something surface dive to avoid a boat and to my surprise when it surfaced again, there was the otter. I was able to watch it for some considerable time as it played in the water, another breathtaking experience.

I had a good walk round Surlingham Church Broad, initially having to navigate a very muddy path in my sandals. Although another walker coming towards me warned me I would never make it, I proved them wrong and didn't muddy my footwear, though my dog had to be carried over the worst part, which was an interesting balancing act. Highlights of the walk was a very obliging kingfisher and a frog which crossed the path in front of us.

While at Seething I saw a couple of greenshanks fly over which drew my attention by calling. It was also good to see a whinchat which was passing through to warmer climes.

As if on cue, jays seem to be everywhere. This normally secretive member of the crow family, is busy collecting and storing acorns to feed on during the winter. It's remarkable to think that each bird may well bury many hundreds of acorns individually and remember exactly where they are buried so they can return to them when food is in short supply.

Well, what will November bring? The only way to find out is to look, whether through a window or while you are out walking.

Gardening Notes

From the Allotment

November is usual a quiet month for harvesting or planting so the focus is on clearing away the things that are over and preparing the ground for next year. Also catching up on the jobs that have been neglected when harvesting is the main concern.

November planting includes garlic and broad beans. You can also plant spring onions and there are varieties of lettuce you can continue to grow under a cloche. There are two sorts of garlic: hardneck and softneck. Hardneck varieties store better though the cloves are smaller. Softneck are usually bigger and plumper but only store for around three months. There are also some very early varieties on the market. To plant, gently break the bulb into cloves and plant the clove root down in a shallow hole 2.5cm (I") deep, I5cm (6") apart and rows 45cm (I8") apart. They need to be watered well in dry weather. Last year I had a poor crop of both garlic and onions on my sandy soil as the weather was dry when it should have been wet and then wet when it should have been dry.

On the other hand, I had a good crops of summer raspberries, grapes (fermenting nicely), butternut squashes, pumpkins, french beans, potatoes (should last until the new ones next year). The apple orchard did better this year and our Allotment Secretary found a completely new apple press on Free Cycle. It's a slippery slope from apple juice to
