Ministerial Musings

Be Prepared.

If you were ever a member of the Scouts you'll know that their motto is 'Be prepared'. It seems like a good idea to think about things beforehand and make sure you don't have any sudden surprises. I've just come back from a holiday for which we were told to be prepared for any sort of weather – I went to the north of Norway, where we could reasonably expect it to be cold and possibly very wet. The list of recommended items to pack included warm clothes to wear in layers, reliable water-proofs and good boots. We were also reminded that on the journey north we might also expect bright sunny weather too. We needed to be ready for anything.

In our day to day lives we are generally used to a regular pattern. We have a good idea of what we will be doing each day, and whether we need to make any additional preparations. Life is reasonably predictable most of the time.

But what about when things don't go according to plan? Or when we feel hurt or let down by other people? Or even when things are wonderful but unexpected, like a surprise party? Often we feel we are just not prepared for what is happening. For me, that's when I am grateful that through prayer I can take everything to God and know that he not only hears me, but also he cares about me.

The reality is, I can't be prepared for all the surprises that life throws at me. None of us can. But we can all share our joys and sorrows with God. He doesn't wave a magic wand and fix things, but he does support us and walk alongside us in every situation if we turn to him. We may not be prepared for everything, but we can be sure that nothing is outside God's care.



Landscaping on George Lane/Roundabout/St Georges Park

I have been contacted by concerned residents of the St Georges Park Estate and elsewhere about the state of the landscaping around this area. I am currently in discussions with the planners and the developer to find a way forward. I believe we are almost at the point where I will be able to give you all timescales on what is going to happen and when. Please be assured this will be dealt with, as we all want to see Loddon looking its best.

Footbridge over the Chet at the Staithe

The works to repair the footbridge are taking longer than I would have hoped, you would not believe the bureaucracy involved! Currently this is with the Environment Agency, as they have to issue a license for works done across a waterway. I am pleased to report that Anglian Water have completed the lining of the pipe that runs under the footbridge. Hopefully this will prevent further incidences of raw sewage escaping into the Chet.

Loddon War Memorial

I was very pleased with the excellent work recently done to the war memorial steps, to sort out a subsidence issue. As part of this, a new ramp has been installed by South Norfolk Council. It all looks very smart and is now safe for wheelchair access. And finished before the Remembrance Day ceremony, as we had asked. I hope to see you all at the parade.

Many residents and visitors enjoy the walking on the Common and the council is trying to secure it for the long-term enjoyment of all. Please get involved, the council needs your help! Councillor Vacancies: There are two vacancies remaining on the council. If you are interested but not sure what's involved, why not come to a meeting and observe? Footway Lighting: The council hasn't received any feedback from residents regarding spiralling energy costs and in the short term is going to attempt to secure a fixed rate contract for the next 12 months. In the long term, the council may have to consider reducing the time the lights are running by switching them off in the middle of the night to save money. Notes from Sisland

When you read this Sisland church will have held an autumn coffee morning, on Saturday 29th October, and we would like to thank everyone who was able to support us, as we continue raising funds to maintain the church fabric. As autumn arrives, the weather definitely changeable, our attention turns to a period of reflection and remembrance.



Changing seasons always makes me reflect on previous

months, this year the incredibly hot summer and a period of national mourning. Remembering - to hold in your mind or bring to mind and to recollect - is an important part of life. We will all be aware in the last months, of remembrances both collectively as well as individually. In Sisland church, the Book of Condolence for Queen Elizabeth II, was valued and completed by residents and visitors alike.

Remembrance Day has been observed every year since 1919. As well as standing together in Remembrance on II November, we also observe a two-minute silence at II am on Remembrance Sunday. The former, originally called "Armistice Day", to commemorate the agreement that ended World War I on Monday, November II, 1918, at II a.m.—on the II th hour of the II th day of the II th month. Just imagine how wonderful it would be if there were maybe **1000** tins and packets added each week to help those people out who cannot afford to feed themselves or their families adequately.

Bread, eggs and cereals go very quickly. There are often quite a few tins of tomatoes and baked beans still on the shelves, whereas other veg and tinned fruit don't stay there long. Tea and coffee also disappear fast.







Loddon and District Local History Group

Our speaker for the September meeting was Steve Silk who introduced us to three books he had written recently, two of them about this area. Steve started by outlining his background in journalism which had started when he worked on a local newspaper in the North East before travelling abroad and writing various articles including one for the India Times. He came to Norwich to work on the Evening News before becoming a T.V. reporter and editor on B.B.C Look East.

'The Wherryman's Way' (published in 2010) emerged as an idea in 2006. The footpath now known as the Wherryman's Way had been 'rebranded' when several existing footpaths had been linked with leaflets outlining different walks becoming available and information boards being placed on the river. A few statues of local 'celebrities' from the past were erected but have not been maintained well. Steve decided to research this river area and found the two sides of the Yare were much better connected than now. There were 15 ferries operating across the river between Norwich and Yarmouth in the early twentieth century. Some ferries were rowing boats while Langley had two to transport staff to Cantley Sugar Works. Yarmouth had two as well. His book sold very well. Steve's second book was entitled 'Hidden Riverside Norwich' (published in 2016). Norwich has 4 rivers - the Yare. Wensum. Tud and Tas. This book outlines a journey Steve made down the Wensum by canoe, mentioning a few of the bridges - Coslany Bridge, St George's Bridge and Bishop's Bridge. The latter involved some research on Kett's Rebellion as rebels had stormed this bridge to win their first battle. Steve hopes this book helps people to realise what they have on their doorstep. He also took the photographs illustrating different aspects of the river.

The third book is very different, 'The Great North Road' (published in 2021) based on a cycle ride he undertook. He came across a book by Charles G. Harper who had made this trip in the late nineteenth century. Harper's thoughts about what he saw were close to his own despite the time difference and he loved the book's illustrations. The Great North Road has a stagecoach history, impacted by the advent of the trains and he mentioned some of the great coaching inns like the George at Stamford. Steve's cycle ride covered about 50 miles a day on average and he found that only 50% of the route was on the old Great North Road while the other 50% was spent trying to get as close as possible to it. He started in London and finished in Edinburgh. Getting published was not easy and he had several rewrites before a publisher accepted it in 2020. This was a fascinating talk.

Read Any Good Books Lately?

Grimwood by Nadia Shireen

A perfect children's book for readers who have just started to enjoy reading on their own. The story itself is brilliantly funny. It's about two foxes who are run out of their urban environment after a battle with a mean cat. They come to a magical place called Grimwood and discover a whole new community, with their own traditions and unique characters.

A Lady's Guide to Fortune-Hunting by Sophie Irwin

I felt like something light and frothy and this is definitely both those things! It's set in Regency England and is perfect for any fans of Georgette Heyer or Bridgerton. It's witty, fast-paced and the ending is very satisfying. The heroine, Kitty, needs to marry money in order to save her sisters, and herself, from destitution. The story tells how she sets about this and although set in Regency England it's a sharp modern take on the whole setting – much like Bridgerton, but far less smutty!

The Marriage Portrait by Maggie O'Farrell

A new novel by one of my favourite authors and a wonderful read. I'm so pleased Maggie O'Farrell has written more historical fiction. I loved Hamnet, set in Shakespearean England, which won the Waterstone's book of the year and Woman's Prize for Fiction in 2020. She breathes life into historical characters by weaving story around them and her writing is rich but so accessible. This is the story of the third daughter of Cosimo de' Medici and her grand marriage set in Renaissance Italy. What Maggie O'Farrell does so well is to convey the menace and danger that lurks around every corner and how young noblewoman, until they have provided an heir, are prisoners to their own fortunes.

Holding by Graham Norton

This is the first novel from the well-known TV personality and he's since written two more. They've been well received and reviewed so I thought I'd give this one a try. It's a great crime story, set in a remote Irish village. Its themes include loss, dark secrets, love, troubled relationships and alcoholism and it's told with Norton's trademark tongue-in-cheek comic timing. It's very well written and an enjoyable read. I will be reading his other two books when I get time.

Special mention to Hilary Mantel who died last month, what a loss but also what a legacy she leaves behind. I plan to reread Wolf Hall and the subsequent novels at some point. If you haven't tried any of her books then I would highly recommend them, her writing is wonderful.

Nature Notes

To begin with I confess that my 2022 bird list was not nearing 200, as I thought but was only 189. Also, although there have been plenty of passage migrants, especially on the Norfolk and Suffolk coast, I've not been out to try and see any of them.

It was the start of the last week of September that I heard the familiar "wink, wink" call of returning Pink Footed Geese. Initially only small skeins, by the end of the week they were around in their hundreds. I have not seen winter thrushes yet, such as Fieldfare and Redwing. Hopefully, this will be rectified by the end of October.

One bird that I should have mentioned last month was that there are a pair of Barn owls around at Hardley Staithe. Having been absent for most of the year, it was great to see a pair of these beautifully graceful birds quartering over the fields.

Walking up the track from Chedgrave Common with our dogs, I kept hearing something bouncing down through the branches of oak trees. I realised it was ripe acorns falling to the ground. Jays, normally a secretive woodland bird, can be seen flying openly from oak tree to oak tree collecting acorns, which they bury to eat during the winter. This can be in the region of three thousand plus acorns buried in small clusters and amazingly remember where they have hidden them.

I managed to see one new bird during September, walking the dogs along the Yare towards the sugar beet factory from Langley Dyke. I noticed several small birds flitting about and picked out Goldfinches and Linnets. Then a female Stonechat revealed itself, perching on top of a reed. It was followed by a second bird, I initially assumed another Stonechat ,but closer scrutiny saw it to be a Whinchat passing through on migration to sunnier climes. Over the next two weeks walking along the same riverbank, the Whinchat was still there. So, my year total crept up to 190.

On the last day of September, whilst getting out the car at Hardley Staithe, I noticed a small flock of, what I assumed were Collared Doves fly over the farm buildings and on into the recently ploughed field. Following them was a second small flock, scanning the field I was delighted to discover that they were in fact Golden Plover rather than the aforementioned doves. Golden Plover migrate from their northern breeding grounds to southern climes. Some overwinter in East Anglia. I stopped on Church Road to see if I could find them again. Sure enough, I found them. However, on closer inspection via binoculars, I realised that although twelve of them were Golden Plovers, there were also three Ruff, another species of wading bird. What delights will November bring, it will be good to escape into the natural world and enjoy what is there

13 November – Sports fields, etc., from Church Plain (3.2 miles)




CAN YOU HELP?

Gardening Notes

From the Allotment—Andrew Milner-Well, time to stop worrying about the damage of the hot dry summer. November is the time to look ahead: clear away the past, plan crops, prepare ground for next year and begin planting crops that go in now. Plan your crops first as once you are sure where everything is going you can prepare the ground accordingly so soil for potatoes needs a boost with manure or compost, but brassicas don't: peas and beans do well over a trench filled with raw or semi composted material. In sandy soil you can also line the bottoms and sides with newspaper to hold in moisture. Compost and newspaper all break down and disappear over the year.

November planting includes garlic and broad beans, but you can also plant peas (beware mice eating these!), winter onions, spring onion seed and varieties of lettuce you can keep growing under a cloche like Fourseason or Winter Density.

My aim with garlic is to grow enough to store until the next harvest which I will not achieve this year as the bulbs were small due to lack of rain over winter and spring.

Hardneck and softneck garlic do well in my sandy soil, but Elephant Garlic does not, and I have stopped trying to grow it. With broad beans my aim is to extend the cropping season and I will plant a second batch in February.

From the Garden—Shirley Cross-This month it is good to spend time looking back at how well the garden performed in the summer drought so that plans can be made for new plantings as predictions are for warmer and drier years

to come. I watered the flower beds this year as they were newly planted and the plants weren't established. Two plants I'd not used before flowered all summer, Cosmos and Gaillardia, deadheading every two days encourages new flowers. The Bessera Elgans bulbs eventually flowered but were shorter than expected. The list of plants the deer

are partial to is growing, currently Hydranga, Sambucus Niger, Campanula Glomerta, Viburnum Opulus Roseum, Deutzia and Pinks. The pinks were a surprise as most websites say deer don't eat them, but they have eaten the flowers, so i will move them to the front. The pond is full at last and is planted up, the bank is planted with Foxgloves, primulas, daffodils, alliums, chionodoxa, Iris, crocus and snowdrops. We also scattered wildflower seeds over the area so it will be interesting to see what comes up. Chrysanthemums are looking good this year with lots of flowers so I will look to add more colours next year. Sweet peas can be sown this month, start them indoors and then move them into a cold greenhouse before planting out next spring. Enjoy planning your garden.
