#### **Ministerial Musings**

It's September again. I always found it strange that the Methodist Church in Britain starts its New Year in September. It is somewhat like school. The new year has begun; we are going into a new class; we have a new teacher!

In the Church of England the New Year begins with Advent.

In the URC the New Year begins in January, as it does for everyone else.

I suppose in some ways it feels like a new year for me because this is the start of my second year here (but I didn't have a 6-week summer break—maybe next year?).

But it got me thinking about new beginnings, and that is what the gospel is all about. Jesus said, "Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit." He was talking about the results of his death and resurrection—He had to die and rise again so that new life could be given to us.

And we see that pattern in our fallen world as the seasons go by and now, at this time of year, the flowers begin to fade and our gardens go over for the winter. But we always have the certainty of spring and summer as the garden comes back to life again.

We are offered that same certainty in our lives. St Paul writes: "For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his." (Romans 6:5).

And while that is talking about the future, there is also Ephesians 2:1, 4-5, "You were dead through the trespasses and sins... But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved."

So death and resurrection—a new beginning—is the theme of the gospel. Everyday we can know that the past is taken care of, dealt with, forgiven. We can know that the future is better than most people's imaginations. And the present can be lived in the assurance that, if we have trusted Jesus, we are "alive together with Christ".

So we can celebrate new beginnings everyday. We don't need someone else's calendar. Today can be a whole new beginning. That is good news!

#### News From Your Local Councillors

**Housing in Loddon:**\_Many of you will now be aware that there is another proposed planning application pending for further housing on Beccles Road, on top of what has already been granted. Although South Norfolk will not have their hands tied into approving it, as they can again demonstrate a 5 year land supply now that the nutrient neutrality issue has been dealt with by the government, we still cannot afford to be complacent. The developer will be holding a consultation locally, look out for the advertisements, and they will be coming to the Loddon Town Council meeting in October to answer questions. Make sure you have your say.

All Saints, Chedgrave: It was heartening to be able to support the Church in getting their planning application for solar panels past the committee, despite officers' recommendations for refusal. The councillors listened to the concerns of local people and voted in our favour, hurrah. As this is a Grade I listed building, the decision must be referred to government before we are sure we can proceed, that's the law. We just have to hope that the Secretary of State backs us too.

#### **On-Call Firefighter Vacancies at Loddon**

Have you got what it takes to fill these boots, wear the uniform and ride on the fire appliance at Loddon? Do you like a challenge?

You don't have to be superman or superwoman, but you do need to be physically fit and be able to pass some tests. You also need to live or work within five minutes safe-travelling-distance of the fire station in Loddon and be available to attend the station at flexible times, including some during the day, evenings, and weekends. On -Call Firefighters all have different 'day' jobs and different reasons why being an oncall firefighter suits their lives. Some do it because they like being part of a team, some do it because they love getting extra qualifications and skills; but all of them do it because they know how important it is to their community, not just the community of Loddon, but the whole of Norfolk. The extra money helps too!

**Cllr John Lurkins:** Councillors and meeting attendees all observed a one minute silence to remember John Lurkins who died on 9<sup>th</sup> July 2023.







## Loddon and District Local History Group

#### Sir William Paxton of Oxnead Hall (really Rob Knee in costume)

Sir William told us about his very complicated family: the first William Paston, a judge, his son John, who acquired Caister Castle from Sir John Fastoff, and another John, who was active during the Wars of the Roses. Several generations later Sir William (1610-1663) moved to Oxnead and collected precious objects on his adventurous travels. He commissioned a painting of his great collection, now called the Paston Treasure. After William's death in 1663, his son Robert 1631-1683 saw the painting completed. It was displayed at the Castle Museum in 2018 as the centrepiece of a major Exhibition. When Charles II was restored to the throne, Robert was created Earl of Yarmouth in recognition of his loyal but costly support. His son another William1630-1685 saw debts mount and Oxnead Hall and contents were eventually broken up and sold (lots went to Blickling nearby).

We know so much about the family because they were great letter writers. The women stayed at home and kept the land holdings and children safe, while their husbands worked in London. These letters and other papers were found in the ruins of Oxnead Hall, by Francis Blomfield, and he and John Fenn from Dereham collated them into a book about the family. The book is still in print. It is a great account of the life and times of an important Norfolk family over many years, and is still a good read!

#### Jonathan Hooton, a Norwich Guide: The Cathedral Close

18 of us met at the Erpingham Gate and followed Jonathan on an extremely informative talk spanning the time period from before the cathedral was built to the present. The building of the Cathedral then church of the Benedictine Monastery was started in 1096 by William II and Bishop Herbert de Losinger, The Close was an area of several parishes and their houses and churches, all were cleared away. It was finally completed in 1145. Stone was imported from Normandy as were the master masons. Nearly all of the buildings in The Close are listed as either Grade I or 2 and each has a fascinating history. Mostly 16<sup>th</sup> and 17th century, some hide traces of older medieval buildings. Norwich School now occupies many of the buildings, including the crypt which at one time was used as a charnel house. The river walk took us past the Cow Tower with its fascinating history; the Swan Pit, the last in England, where Swans for the table were fattened as late as1918; onto Bishops Bridge and Pull's Ferry (the opening of the long filled in canal which carried stone from the river to the masons). Jonathan painted a wonderful picture for us of the changes that had occurred in this lovely area.

# Nature Notes

Well, here we are well into Autumn as we begin the month of October.

The moles are active again back in our garden, this time they seem to enjoy tunneling under our patio, somehow managing to push piles of earth out between the half centimeter gaps between our patio slabs. How they manage to achieve this without injuring themselves I don't know.

Out walking the dogs, the other evening, we came across a hedgehog, fortunately both our dogs were content with just a quick sniff before continuing the walk. We have also seen hedgehogs on visits to Brundall.

During August it has been noticeable how quiet and seemingly absent our avian songsters have been. Equally the number of birds on our feeding station has been low. It is only since the beginning of September that wrens and robins, having both raised a family and gone through a moult, have started to sing again. Walks along the riverbanks have been equally quiet; the reedbeds have fallen silent though the other day as a cormorant took off from a dike it obviously upset a water rail which started squealing its objection.

I took the dogs down to Dunwich on bank holiday Monday and enjoyed a walk both on the stones and the grassy path behind the shingle bank. Once we had walked a couple of hundred yards we were virtually on our own, unfortunately that also included birdlife. So, I resorted to looking out for the various plants that inhabited this area. When flowering, identification is much easier. There were small clumps of Sea Aster, Restharrow and the bright yellow Horned Poppy, Sea Mayweed, Lady's Bedstraw and Common Toadflax, these were the ones I was able to photograph and check identification when I got home. By now despite the frequent stops our elderly dog was showing signs of being tired, so, back to the carpark we went. Just as we were passing the last pool a wader flew off calling. My first thought was Redshank, as there had been a couple of them there as we started our walk, but the call was all wrong and the bird had no white on its wings. Next option was Greenshank. I used my phone to listen to what a Greenshank sounded like which confirmed for me that it was a Greenshank, the first I had seen this year.

With October the winter migrants will be making an appearance, so who is going to hear or see the first skeins of Pink footed Geese fly over or the first Fieldfare or Redwing?

With all that is going on both in this country and round the world it's good to get out or even look out of a window and enjoy the beauty of the creation that's all around us.

# Allotment & Gardening Notes

## From the Allotment

Again, I feel it necessary to say when I write this—early September—in a heatwave. Goodness knows what the weather will be when you read this, but it makes it very difficult to look forward and give advice on what to plant or harvest. In the cooler wet spell (summer!) I speculated by planting radish and spinach, which would normally bolt, and was rewarded with a good crop of radish, but nothing from the spinach. I have also planted potatoes for winter harvest. My squashes recovered from a slow start and are prolific, ripening rapidly in the late sun as are the courgettes. The autumn raspberry varieties and blackberry cultivars are also doing well. The French Beans did better than the runners; both are now over, but I have left the last pods to ripen so I can collect the seed. The grape harvest again promises a good year if I can keep the birds off.

October is usually a quiet month in the allotment as you finish harvesting summer crops and start preparing the ground for next year. On my dry sandy allotment this will mean spreading, trenching or digging in as much organic matter as possible to help retain moisture and then after rain covering it over with a mulch/weed suppressant like old carpet, cardboard or newspaper weighed down with grass clippings or wood chip. The cardboard and newspaper will start to decompose over the winter and the remains can be torn up and added to compost in spring.

October is the best month for bulb planting and the garden centres will have plenty of choices. We intend to continue planting up the bank behind the pond that we started this time last year. The daffodils looked great, using several different varieties, single and doubles meant we had a longer display followed by camassias and alliums. For the time being I will keep with the blue and yellow colour scheme, but this might change if I get tempted at the garden centre! The temperature as I write is very hot and it is hard to imagine a cold winter and spring! The dahlias have put on a lovely display and hopefully this will last until the late chrysanthemums start flowering. In August we visited Barnsdale, Geoff Hamilton's garden in Rutland, the gardens he created for Gardeners World in the 1980's and 90's are still there, it is well worth a visit, the allotment garden was bursting with produce and flowers. The gardens are looked after by his son Nick (and a small team), who has a nursery next door and a very nice tearoom. Enjoy your garden.

## **End Piece**

#### **Broken Glass**

Imagine the heartbreaking discovery of broken windows in our churches, Holy Trinity in Loddon and All Saints in Chedgrave: flints on the floor, glass all over the place. Imagine the feeling when hearing a log come through your house window.

Many people in our communities will know that this is exactly what happened mid-August. The damage, particularly at All Saints where the mediaeval stained glass has been especially badly affected, is going to be hugely expensive to repair. In Loddon, the estimate is ~£6,000; In Chedgrave the estimate is ~£60,000 for the work. Fortunately much of that will be covered by insurance but in Chedgrave we have been advised to treat the ancient glass to prevent deterioration of the mediaeval glass, and also such vandalism in the future. That is not covered by insurance and will cost another £35,000-£40,000. How will our congregation cover that?

The evening we discovered our broken windows, there was a news item on the television about an area in Pakistan where there had been mob violence against a Christian community in northern Punjab. At least one church was burned down, four others damaged; and two dozen homes were torched or badly damaged during the riots. It put our sorrow into perspective. The damage to our churches was far less severe and we believe it was mindless vandalism rather than being religiously motivated.

We were reflecting a few days later: at least no-one was hurt in the incidents, and the church is more than its buildings. For us, church is about relationship between people, and not just the church family. It has been heartwarming to have been approached by people in the community, some who I don't know, who have said, "I am not a church person, but that's my church and I am really upset and angry about this. What did they think they were doing? Can I do anything to help?" And I was messaged by a teenager who said, "It's just sad what people are doing these days... a group of kids trying to find something stupid to do and thinking it's funny... it truly is just ruining this generation". Support like this has been so encouraging and we are really thankful for it.

So what can we do? How can the community help?

Clearly there is going to have to be a huge fundraising effort and at a time when people are really strapped for cash. Please watch out for events and come and support us. And if you do have spare money and are looking for somewhere to use it, then donations can be made to our churches:
