# **Ministerial Musings**

We continue to live through challenging times. In the aftermath of the pandemic, realising the devastation of climate change, and listening to news about war and trauma in the world it is no wonder that people of all ages are overwhelmed by these things. Everyone is also dealing with their own situation. There may be financial worries, family concerns, illness, problems at work, or stress of keeping a business afloat to name a few. Many suffer with mental health issues. Thankfully charities such as the Samaritans, MIND, and RABI are working to help people who are struggling. Those who work in farming and other rural businesses are often reluctant to seek support for depression, stress, or anxiety. YANA (You Are Not Alone) provides rural mental health support offering specific help for those involved with farming or other rural businesses in East Anglia. You might find that sharing your experience helps. If you can't talk to someone close to you, YANA can give you confidential help. Making that first phone call is a major step forward. If you think you might be suffering from depression, talk to someone you trust. If negative thoughts come easily to us we need to be aware of them and be able to counteract them with a more balanced view. We can give ourselves negative and positive messages and need to try to focus on positive messages when we face a challenge. There are some things we can do to help. Perhaps think of things that we are grateful for, even if they are small everyday things like a nice cup of tea, being thankful for those who grow and process the tea, for the cows producing the milk and those who work on dairy farms. When eating a juicy apple, being thankful for the apple harvest and those who transport them to the shops. If we can take a walk and look closely at nature around us, berries, flowers, birds, animals, running water, a beautiful sunrise or sunset, this can really lift our spirits.

Creation is amazing, thank God for all the beauty in the world and the good things we enjoy, giving thanks for his love for us and the promise of life through Jesus Christ. On reading the Psalms in the Bible we find guidance and wisdom for every situation. For times when we are anxious and afraid and for the times of thankfulness when we are happy.

Psalm 9 verses 9 and 10 remind us 'The Lord is a refuge for the oppressed, a place of safety in times of trouble. Those who know you, Lord, will trust you for you do not abandon anyone who comes to you'.

Chet Valley Community Larder: In these difficult times I was very pleased to be asked to get involved with a new initiative to set up a community larder behind the Library. A joint venture including Loddon and Chedgrave parish councils and our churches it is supported by the Co-op and volunteers. It will be open to surrounding villages as well and be a central point where food can be left and collected. How it operates will be advertised locally and flyers distributed. The Staithe Footbridge: Following a recent sewage spillage from the manholes either side of the river Chet, Anglian Water have agreed to replace the pipe that runs under the footbridge. They are confident that this will solve the problem, as the new plastic pipe will not clog up the way the old metal one does. Anglian Water will do this work at the same time that we refurbish the bridge, which will save costs. A survey is underway to see if the banks either side will need any reinforcing. Policing: I was very pleased to be able to accompany the Loddon beat manager lames King and neighbourhood sergeant lason Ellis around the village. This is something we try to do regularly, so if you see us, please stop for a chat. We try to walk different areas and look at any reported problems. This time we went to St Georges Park, Kittens Lane and High Bungay Road. If you have anything you would

**Defibrillator:** Sited on Yarmouth Road wall of Masala Garden. If needed the machine gives spoken instructions. The defibrillator takes readings of the patient to make sure appropriate treatment is given so a shock is only used if it is necessary.

**Permissive Field & Hales Green:** Please observe the Countryside Code and use commonsense. If walking a dog don't let it run up to other dogs or people. This is only OK if the other owner gives permission. Please note if your dog is the aggressor you are responsible for any damages. Please pick up after your dog – their poo is a health hazard and dangerous as well as being unpleasant for others.

**Village Spending for 2023:** We want your ideas on how the budget should be split in 2023-2024. Our income of £10,000 this year is being used to pay for the villages' insurance, look after the playground, village maintenance and other administrative costs. Any idea you think good for the village is welcome.

**Wildflowering:** It is still hot and we hope for rain. If you can help with wild flower sowing and planting around the villages when the ground is damp and the weather cooler let the Clerk know. There are likely to be several planting sessions.

**Composting Group:** Our scheme began in 2015. We have accumulated 55.8 tonnes of garden waste, saving a large number of journeys to the Bergh Apton Refuse Site and reduced the number of journeys made by the Council to collect waste from Brown Bins. However, our numbers of volunteers and members are falling. It has reached the stage where the future of the scheme is now in doubt.

We need more people to want to leave their garden waste at our site. This is done by agreeing a drop off time with the scheme administrators so that waste can be weighed and placed into the storage bins. The administrators are happy to vary the drop off times to suit members and can often agree weekend slots by prior arrangement. Please consider joining our scheme. It is easier for you, it is ecologically better and the Parish Council receives payment based on the weight of waste collected. # **Norfolk Home Library Service**

Norfolk home library expands service and calls for new users and volunteers.

Calling all book lovers and digital masters! A popular home library service delivered by Royal Voluntary Service and the Norfolk Library and Information Service is looking to expand throughout Norfolk.

A new digital inclusion program is also being trialled, in which specially trained volunteers teach the service's clients how to access critical information digitally, and how to download books online. Expansion means the Home Library Service is looking to welcome new clients, volunteers, and Coordinators to the team.

Volunteers work alongside their local library to select and deliver books and other media to those who may find it difficult to leave the house, have mobility issues, or caring responsibilities. The service also provides regular, friendly social contact to check if clients are safe and well, to discuss reading and listening preferences, and to report any concerns to appropriate services as needed.

Volunteer Coordinators liaise with local libraries, manage a network of local volunteers to arrange book deliveries, recruit new volunteers, and build relationships with local community groups to promote the service. As part of the new digital inclusion program, Digital Service Coordinators may offer their skills in workshops to train volunteers to use various devices, apps, and programs that the service's clients may find challenging.

Alicia Stillman, Service Manager for Royal Voluntary Service Norfolk Home Library Service says: "For people who find leaving their homes problematic, the Home Library Service is a vital link to the local library and welcome connection to a friendly face. The Covid-19 pandemic has shone a light on the significant number of vulnerable adults living in isolation. During the last two years, it has also become apparent that many socially isolated people were not able to access vital information due to digital illiteracy. Instruction on downloading eBooks, accessing GP and Council services, and setting up video conferencing can often be more easily explained in person, in an informal setting, one on one. Through the new digital inclusion program, with the help of our volunteers, we hope to bring clients back to the activities they love, prevent further isolation, and provide companionship and support."





# **Loddon and District Local History Group**

On Friday I Ith June at I I.00 am on a beautiful summer's morning, 22 of us gathered in the car park of **Raveningham Hall**. We were quickly gathered up by Sonja, PA to Sir Nicholas Bacon who gave us our refreshment permits and led us to the back door of the Hall. Here Sir Nicholas greeted us and gave us a potted history of the house and family. He then took us into the ground floor rooms, with some lovely decoration and family portraits as well as old masters.

Although the family have lived at Raveningham since 1735 the line goes back to another Nicholas Bacon, a Lawyer, in the time of Elizabeth I, the son of a Suffolk yeoman. We then went off to the café opened especially for us.

We were then free to wander around the beautiful gardens and lake (a millennium project). There were sculptures at the end of walks, and wonderful views over the park and wildlife meadow. My favourite was The Stumpery, a shady dell with tree ferns and upturned stumps (which Sir Nicholas told us he had manoeuvred into place with the help of his son and a JCB). The Gardens are open Wednesday - Friday and Sundays during the summer.

On Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> July Phyllida Scrivens returned to Loddon to talk about her latest book, *The Great Thorpe Railway disaster of 1874*. At the time the greatest loss of life (27) in a British railway accident. She described the scene in Norwich Railway Station which led to the accident, and then the accident and its aftermath. Phyllida who lives in Thorpe had felt for many years that the story of the accident and especially its victims and heroes should be told.

During Covid Lockdown she had researched the stories of many of those people and her lively and clear presentation left us all wanting to know more. We, of course, bought a copy of the book to add to our library.

### Tim all alone by Edward Ardizzone

My husband recently reminded me of the fantastic classic picture books by Edward Ardizzone. ### The City of Tears by Kate Mosse

# **Nature Notes**

The beginning of August and the hot dry weather we've been "enjoying" through July have caused some trees to make it look more like Autumn. Hopefully leaves are turning orange/brown trying to conserve water and not because they are dying.

Highlights for the past two months have been a family of Shelduck along Cross Stone Street; I always enjoy seeing the black and white "humbug" ducklings as the parents lead them to water. Both parents are similar in plumage unlike other ducks where the males are colourful and the females have a more camouflaged plumage. To avoid detection the Shelduck's make their nests in old rabbit burrows. On another occasion driving along Cross Stone Street, a flash of orange and electric blue as a Kingfisher flew across the road in front of me and proceeded to fly over the corn field towards Langley School. Earlier the same week there was a Hobby, a small migrant bird of prey, flying over the same field hawking for dragonflies.

I did take a friend up to Trimmingham to see the Bee-eaters, and it was fascinating to watch these colourful birds sitting on the electricity wires making the occasional sortie to catch an insect. Now that four young have fledged there are up to eleven of them. It has become an additional attraction for North Norfolk, when we visited the carpark was virtually full. On another occasion I took the same friend to see Honey Buzzards at Swanton Novers Wood. There is a rapture watchpoint operated by Natural England. Honey Buzzards used to breed there regularly but have been missing for the past thirteen years so to have two pairs of this summer migrant was really special. We weren't disappointed as two of them flew right over our heads. We also saw Goshawks there as well, making it an enjoyable trip.

Working in a field in Seething, I became aware of something behind me. Turning around, I was confronted with a Red Kite as it managed to just fly over my head. It had been trying to pick up a young dead rabbit, which was close to where I was, and must have suddenly noticed my presence and took evasive action. While on the subject of Red Kite, while dog walking along the Yare from Langley Dyke early in August, I was entertained by a family group of four Red Kite's along with a number of Marsh Harriers, Buzzards, Kestrels and single Peregrine and Sparrowhawk. Back to Seething and it was amusing to watch a male pheasant standing on the top of an ash pile give his call, flap his wings and disappear in a cloud of ash dust. When seeing puffs of what looked like smoke rising above our garden fence, on investigation I found three pheasants enjoying a dust bath in another pile of ash.

# **Gardening Notes**

#### From the Allotment—Andrew Milner

The year started well with no late damaging frosts, but the hot weather and drought has taken its toll. My allotment with its dry sandy soil and minimal shade looks decidedly brown. Little is growing outside of the polytunnel, and somethings have died. I harvested my early soft fruit crops successfully, but the strawberries now look almost dead and the summer raspberries already need the old canes removing and the new ones tying in. The autumn raspberries follow usually provide a better crop for me, but they are barely producing. Other bush soft fruits now need pruning to maintain their goblet shapes for good air circulation.

The heat stopped the onions and potatoes growing but fortunately they were big enough to get a reasonable harvest. After experimenting over the years, I think I can now recommend two good first early varieties for sandy soil: Maris Bard which is a waxy salad variety, and Foremost which is larger and floury, the later are deliciously creamy baked as soon as they are out of the ground.

Experiments this year included gherkins (planned), these have been too successful, and from just three plants I have more than enough to keep me in pickled gherkins for years; and kohlrabi (unplanned I just saw a pack of 8 reduced in price). This weird looking brassica was a revelation, easy to grow, a mild flavour, excellent in coleslaw and stir fry. Don't leave them in the ground too long as they go woody.

# From the Garden—Shirley Cross

Well 2022 will certainly be memorable and not just for the Platinum Jubilee. I hope soon we will have had a few rain showers and your gardens will be recovering. I concentrated on watering flower beds nearest the house, mulch helped. The pond was full until the heatwave, so I've delayed any planting until we get rain. Deer have nibbled a few plants, these will be moved to beds at the front of the house, their favourites so far are Ceanothus, Sambucas Niger, Hydrangea and Campanula Glomerata. Dahlias are doing well, so far they have received no attention from the deer, I may add a few more next year, the choice of varieties is vast and they've certainly enjoyed the sun. Now it's time to plant spring bulbs. I will plant daffodils, snowdrops and alliums as these are not eaten by the deer, they do eat bluebells but only the leaves. My planned visit to Wenhaston Grange didn't happen due to Covid, but I did manage a trip to RHS Bridgewater. The gardens are vast, the planting is very impressive and there are plenty of seats to enjoy the views. The tomatoes are doing well and the cucumber has lots of flowers and small green fruit, the chillies are disappointing, I used saved seed so maybe not reliable. I may try Marzano plum tomatoes next year as the flavour is one the best plum tomatoes.

# **End Piece**

#### Can we make at least one of our roads safer for residents?

Driving out of Loddon, past Wards the Butchers along High Bungay Road towards the A146, you pass a road sign permitting you to accelerate from 20 to 30 mph.

Within 30 yards of this sign, hidden on the left by the slight bend in the road, is a junction allowing access into Davy Court. Many of the residents here are elderly, some with disabilities. Probably many won't have private transport and will either be walking into the village or, if going further afield, going to the bus stops, situated either side of the road where the 30mph sign stands. There is no pavement to assist them as they come out onto High Bungay Road, they are standing in the road and, as previously mentioned, the slight bend in the road hides them from view at first.

Many of us are familiar with this situation and, no doubt, allow for it when passing the junction, but for those who either don't know or don't think, they can be 'legally' accelerating just as someone steps out from Davy Place.

Is it not beyond the efforts of our locally elected officials to look into this with a view to at least asking for the 30mph sign to be moved beyond the Davy Road junction towards the south to reduce the risk to foot travellers there? Maybe they haven't noticed it themselves , quite understandably, so this could be a chance to make a step towards greater safety. Local councillors have warned us against speeding in the past, so they are clearly keeping an eye on local problems.

Perhaps even to move it the full length of High Bungay Road may be the answer. The east side of the road has no pavement along its full length, narrow pavement in part on the west side and there are a variety of residential and road accesses onto it along its length, not least the exit from Low Bungay Road which, due to the sharp angle and banked garden at the junction, has visibility restricted for vehicles exiting.

Hopefully, in time, all of our roads in the community can be reduced to 20mph because one often can't drive any faster anyway and actually, who needs to for the literally few seconds saved between one side of the village and the other? The Welsh Government is already planning to do this in all built up areas and it looks like a good idea to me - **Editor**
