#### You are welcome to join us at any of our services

**Holy Communion** is celebrated every Sunday at one or other of the Chet Valley Churches: either Book of Common Prayer (BCP) or Common Worship, with an informal Holy Communion service once a month in Chedgrave.



Morning Worship is held regularly in Loddon and Hardley.

Evening Prayer (BCP) is on the third Sunday of the month in Sisland.

XPRESSIONS CAFÉ is on the first Sunday of the month at All Saints Chedgrave. This is a relaxed and contemporary way of 'doing church'. Open between 10:00am and 12:00 noon you can come and go as you please for coffee, cake, discussion, crafts, games, stories, reflection and much more.

#### **News From Your Local Councillors**



**Beccles Road development:** Despite our best efforts to object to the planning application from Hopkins Homes, permission was granted for 180 new houses off the Beccles Road. Town Council members and I, along with some representatives of local residents, attended the meeting to make our views known. To give South Norfolk Council its due, they were in a difficult position, being faced with agreeing to the application or facing an appeal if they refused it, which they would certainly have lost, thereby costing £100,000+ of taxpayers' money. The developers knew this and pushed for a decision; this is what we are up against until the nutrient neutrality issue is solved, and we once again can demonstrate a 5-year land supply in the district. I will continue to push Hopkins to make improvements to their plans they have for the site and will resist any further developments that fail to consider local people's views.

**A146:** Many of us have been frustrated by the road works on this major route caused by Anglian Water's failure to fix their pipes effectively. This is a problem that has existed for many years. I bumped into their Chief Executive at a meeting in London recently and impressed upon him how important it is that this is sorted out once and for all. He has promised to look into it.

Chedgrave Parish Council held its meeting on 6<sup>th</sup> July 2023 and there was no meeting in August.

#### **John Lurkins**

It was with great sadness that the parish council received the news of the death of longstanding member, Councillor John Lurkins, on 9th July 2023. John moved to Chedgrave at the age of eight and over the years was instrumental in many projects to the benefit of our community such as the development of the Jubilee Hall and the Brian Clarke Room. John was an active member of the parish council for many decades (at least 46 years!) and his service spanned both the Silver and Platinum Jubilees of the late Queen Elizabeth II. John was involved in many projects over the years but he really seemed to enjoy the annual Easter Egg Hunt, and, in his words "seeing happy children with their families gathering for the Annual Easter Egg hunt in The Pits play area." The council is grateful for John's many years of service.


Paths in and around Chedgrave: The council is very much aware of various issues relating to footpath maintenance around the village and the frustration it is causing. Councillor Deb Downer has been following up on this matter with NCC Highways and continues to do so and the council will be writing to our County Councillor for help in this matter. The council is also considering the option of an interim cut to supplement NCC mowing to help prevent the problem in future.

**Footway Lighting:** As previously updated, the council is considering fitting timers to most of the footway lighting in the village (excluding Rectory Lane and the alleyways) so that they switch off during the middle of the night to save on energy and help nocturnal creatures. If you have any final comments on this idea, please contact the clerk.

Chedgrave Common: The council is Sole Trustee of Chedgrave Common Charity (255453) and now that the majority of Chedgrave Common has been registered, the council is in the process of migrating the management of Chedgrave Common over to the charity. Management will remain in line with Broads Authority and Norfolk Wildlife Trust guidance but will hopefully give more scope for greater community involvement.

#### Planning Application 2021/2437 & 2021/2522, Beccles Road, Loddon:

The planning application for 171 dwellings with access, parking, open space and landscaping and outline planning permission for a phased development for the erection of nine self-build dwelling on Beccles Road was approved at South Norfolk Council's (SNC) Development Management Committee on the 2<sup>nd</sup> August. LTC Cllrs attended, and disappointingly LTC's request for a revised layout was not taken into consideration. Due to 'Nutrient Neutrality', SNC cannot demonstrate a five-year land supply for housing. Loddon is not affected by Nutrient Neutrality and is very vulnerable to speculative planning applications. The recording of the meeting can be accessed via our website.

Scott Properties will be holding a consultation event on a prospective housing application for approximately 100 houses off Beccles Road at the Jubilee Hall on the 25<sup>th</sup> September from 2:00pm-7:00pm. They have agreed to feedback the results of the consultation at the Council meeting on the 11<sup>th</sup> October in The Hollies.

The Regulation 14 Consultation of stakeholders and residents on the draft Chet Neighbourhood Plan took place in June and July. Four consultation events, two in Chedgrave and two in Loddon, were well-attended. They produced helpful comments on the policies we have written to influence planning decisions in Loddon and Chedgrave. We have also received many completed surveys.

All the comments we have received will be carefully considered as we finalise the plan. Once that is done, it, and supporting documentation, will be submitted to the planning authority for approval. When that is achieved there will be a referendum, open to all electors of Loddon and Chedgrave, to approve (we hope) the final version, which will then have legal status.

#### **Notes from Sisland**

As I am writing this in early August, I want to thank all those who have supported the Sunday teas at Sisland church, whatever the weather. It has been lovely to catch up with old friends, as well as welcome new visitors who have discovered our beautiful church. We all know what challenges we have all faced in recent years but the opportunity to sit, reflect and share has been enjoyed by many. Although it is the main fundraiser for St Mary's it offers so much more to so many. (Scones and cake were delicious; we met some new folk too. Ed.)



The very mixed season meant that although some of the churchyard had been cut by the start of August—in fact in early July—the lack of some continuous dry days lead to other challenges in finishing cutting. As we move from the summer months into the autumn, our attention turns to the change in seasons. The word 'harvest' comes from the Old English word hærfest meaning 'autumn', apt for the season when we gather in so much of our local produce. In the UK, harvest festival, which is also known as the harvest home, has traditionally been celebrated on the Sunday nearest the harvest moon. This is the full moon that occurs closest to the autumn equinox. In 2023, September's full moon will be on 29<sup>th</sup> September. As the moonrise comes shortly after sunset there can be an abundance of moonlight early in the evening, which enabled farmer workers to work later into the evening to complete the harvest. Although we now fix and plan for this celebration, without reference to the moon, in the past the harvest festival differed, based on a date when all the crops had been brought in; a period when the whole community, including children, needed to help right up until the end, as lives depended on the success of the harvest.

The Harvest Festival service in Sisland this year, will be at 5:00pm on Sunday I7<sup>th</sup> September, not as close to the September moon as in some years! The service will contain all the traditional elements that you would expect and will allow us to connect with the environment around us, so key to the farming season. We hope to see you there.





### **Loddon and District Local History Group**

In June Chris and Stephie Kolonka-Weet gave us an interesting talk about 'Defending Norfolk 1940-1942: The Home Forces'. There was an imminent threat of German invasion so to counter this the Julius Caesar plan was drafted and implemented by Sir Walter Kirke. 1941 saw the consolidation of existing defences and further construction of pillboxes, with three slit trenches for each, anti-tank islands and barbed wire placed along the coastline. New weapons systems were introduced for the Regulars, the Terratorial Army (TA) and the Home Guard who were given more responsibility to free up the rest of the army's units. By 1942 the immediate threat of invasion was considered over and coastal defences were reduced. In December 1944 the Home Guard was disbanded.

East Anglia was particularly vulnerable to an attack as an invasion fleet from North Germany could be landed in a night and once France and Belgium fell in June 1940 the north east became vulnerable too. By the end of 1940 the south coast became equally vulnerable. Chris then outlined the home forces available: the Royal Navy and coastal command would provide an early warning; the RAF's bomber and fighter command would bomb beach heads and attack any enemy infantry should they land; the Royal Artillery and Coastal Batteries could intercept landing craft while troops from the Regular and TA would hold up any invading troops. The Home Guard were to be a localised defence and could guide the regular army but they were badly equipped to begin with and were not intended to be the front line.

Chris then mentioned some of the Commanders-in-Chief of the Home Forces who had to provide equipment and training and plan where troops should be deployed. In Norfolk there were two divisions with 8-10,000 in each. Between June 1940 and January 1941 they operated a series of defence lines around where roads and rails connected near towns like Yarmouth. One type of line (red) needed enough supplies so that they could hold out for seven days while a second type (green) aimed to hold out for two days with fewer supplies.

Chris and Sophie then mentioned some of their research methods like the use of archaeological recording of surviving defences, aerial photographs and use of GIS. Today, the role and post-war legacy of the home forces is largely forgotten but Chris argued that there is much more to learn.


#### A Very Short Introduction to... various authors

#### **Nature Notes**

As you read this, we will be entering the season of autumn; the nights drawing in, and summer's visiting birds will be leaving our shores to be replaced by our winter visitors. As I write, I am wishing I was outside in glorious sunshine, rather than inside watching the rain pour down and wondering just when I will be able to walk the dogs in the dry.

My bird-watching recently has been restricted to local walks with the dogs. While I haven't seen any new species for my depleted year list, just seeing what is around has none-the-less been enjoyable. Yesterday, at Seething, we were entertained and enchanted by both a red kite and a buzzard circling overhead, followed by the laughing yaffle of a green woodpecker as it flew across the field in its undulating flight. A few weeks back I was watching a male yellowhammer running round on the ground lifting its wings vertically above its back. It became obvious what it was doing when a female came out of the shadows: he was showing of his prowess. Was he successful? I don't know as they both flew off!

At the beginning of July there was a lack of birds using our feeding station, but as the month progressed it became inundated with young blue and great tits and a regular male greater spotted woodpecker (recognized by the red cap at the rear of its head).

While walking the dogs across the track from Cross Stone Street to Hardley Hall, I was first aware of a small flock of birds flying from the wood to one of the oak trees in the hedge, followed by a call that initially I didn't recognise. Having my binoculars with me I scanned the tree and discovered that at least some of the birds in the flock were blue tits. My brain then engaged, and I realised the call I had heard was a nuthatch and sure enough it wasn't long before it appeared round a branch on its search for food. I was able to enjoy its foraging exploits for a few minutes before continuing with the walk.

One thing the wet weather has made more obvious are amphibians. We have noticed several frogs in the garden. Also, on a late evening walk with the dogs we came across a toad on the road which fascinated our young dog. I was able to take some good photos of her puzzled expression, only to discover looking at them later that we had failed to spot a newt which was also there. On an excursion to Hardley Staithe, I noticed a grass snake by the side of the road thrashing about. Thinking it was injured, I parked safely and went to investigate only to discover that it was attempting to remove a squashed frog, which it finally succeeded in doing, slithering off into the roadside undergrowth. I also found a grass snake sunbathing against our front doorstep!

You never know what you might come across as you are out and about or even looking through a window, that can brighten any day, so enjoy.

### **Allotment & Gardening Notes**

#### From the Allotment

For the allotments, at least, the rains came just at the right moment to revive the beans, brassicas and squashes which had been marking time, though it was too late for my onions as rabbits got under the netting and took the tops off. Normally the onions would revive and continue growing but this was followed by the very hot dry spell and some of the onions bolted. More positive news is we have been eating delicious earthy new potatoes since early July though these are also generally small. Gooseberries, early summer raspberries and blackcurrants are all picked and eaten or frozen. The rhubarb also revived in the rain and is once again ready to eat. In the polytunnel, cucumbers, tomatoes and aubergines are ripe. The peppers and chillis will be a little longer. I also have one melon from my experimental planting!

My avid reader will remember that a friend with an orchard took cuttings from some old Norfolk apple varieties in our orchard and was pleased that seven of these grafts have taken. We are happy to help preserve these old varieties and share cuttings with anyone else who wants them. The allotment holders were busy in June thinning the apple crop to a double or single fruit at each cluster to encourage larger fruits to develop, particularly as the June drop didn't appear to take place. However, the crop is still small, and the earliest apples were ripe before the end of July. **Andrew Milner** 

#### From the Garden

Well, 2023 has certainly been a bit different from last year; hot and dry and then wet and windy! This year the strong southerly winds have battered some of the taller plants, so may have to move them or increase the supports. The dahlias have been flowering well, they are not so tall this year, maybe due to the extreme winter temperatures. Only one variety, Thomas Edison, didn't survive and I have replaced this as well as adding a few more varieties. The three outdoor amaryllis I planted earlier in the year all flowered but not at the same time which was a bit disappointing as I had planted them in one large pot. The bank around the pond flowered well first with daffodils, then camassia and then alliums so the remaining bank will be planted up in the same way in October/November. We plan to add yellow rattle and wildflowers to the bank to extend the season beyond June. The pond plants are doing well and we have had three flowers on the water lily so far. The pond has been visited by lots of wildlife, dragonflies, damselflies, small birds, water snails and frogs amongst others.

Jobs for this month: take salvia cuttings to increase my plants, as I did lose a couple over the winter; and sow collected perennial seeds to overwinter in the greenhouse. The spring bulbs will now be available in the garden centres.
