Of course I couldn't let Jack go without a big thank-you for all that he has contributed to local news distribution over the years. Before Facebook, Twitter and local websites (not all that long ago!) local newsletters were the only comprehensive channels of local news, and they still fulfil a significant role. Where else do you find all the information about little local groups and organisations, and adverts of tradespeople who deal with every eventuality?

So, a big thank-you Jack for being a trailblazer who offered to get involved with setting up Chet News in the first place, and being the committed volunteer who ensured that the newsletter ran for so long. We hope that Chet Contact will continue to serve the communities for many years to come.

Ministerial Musings

It was a year ago this month that all of our lives changed dramatically, a year that we will be talking of for many years to come: a cataclysmic milestone, the point when the world changed.

For far too many people the changes wrought by the pandemic were and will continue to be painful, with loved ones lost, bodies weakened by long Covid, jobs disappearing, mental health in tatters and businesses ruined.

We cannot move to anything like normal human life until we acknowledge the body blow that this pandemic has dealt us, perhaps by expressing the anger we feel about this 'wasted' year, shouting at God as the Psalmist did many centuries ago, 'You have plunged me into the lowest abyss, into the darkest regions of the depths, your wrath bears heavily on me, you have brought me all your fury'. (Psalm 88, 6-7)

This is the season of Lent in the Church, a time of soul searching and reflection, a time to think about where our lives are going and whether that is the right direction. For all of us, whether we observe Lent or not, whether we believe in God or not, this stage of the pandemic as we tentatively start to open up our lives is a time to think about the direction in which we are heading.

Can any good come out of the pandemic? I believe that it can, but only if we choose to learn some of its harsh lessons: that our actions have consequences and those consequences can mean life or death to others. That the people, the animals and the plants that make our world are fragile. That we are all connected and that we ignore those connections at our peril.

Chief Seattle of the Squamish tribe is said to have spoken to those in power in America in the 1850s, stating: 'The earth does not belong to man. Man belongs to the earth. Man has not woven the net of life: he is just a thread in it. Everything he does to this net he does to himself. '

Perhaps after all these years, as we begin to emerge from a global pandemic, we may begin to see the wisdom of those words.

Loddon and District Local History

Nearly a year after the arrival of Covid and the progress of the vaccination roll

out I am optimistic we will meet again soon. Cataloguing of the Archive is going well and research continues. My thanks as ever to those who are working so hard on our behalf.

This month I write about George who had a hard start in Victorian Loddon.

Before 1839, keeping order was the responsibility of the Churchwardens with the Parish Constables. Norfolk founded its Constabulary in 1839 and built police stations around the County. Loddon's impressive Victorian Police Station built in 1847 stands on Beccles Road. Superintendent Hubbersty was there in 1851, he moved away soon afterwards to Winchester where he became Head Constable.

Inspector George White 1834-1924 was one of the 4th generation of his family to live and work in Loddon. His parents were George White and Susannah Stratford.

Great grandfather Jeremiah White 1753-1737; Grandfather William 1785-1824 and father George are all described as bricklayers when their children were baptised.

Jeremiah owned a large plot of land, west of the Street. His home was possibly the present Ivy Cottage near Vine Court. After Jeremiah's death his estate was sold and the money raised was used to pay his debts and give legacies to his children, particularly his daughters. Part of the property was sold to Mary White's husband, Henry Riches Blacksmith.

Both George's father George and grandfather William predeceased Jeremiah. So George, the policeman, was raised in a one parent family. His widowed mother Susanna was a shoebinder as was his sister Elizabeth. He possibly attended the village National School, run in the Guildhall and by 1851 George was working as a bricklayer's labourer.

Norfolk Constabulary was founded in 1839, one of the first county forces formed. Applicants had to meet standards of education, health. height and good character, and I think be 21 years old. George must have worked hard, and done well at school to be appointed.

In1861 he is a Police Constable married to Eliza Bales, living in Swaffham. He rose through the ranks to Inspector, retiring to Loddon. By 1891 he is widowed (Eliza d1883) and living in High Bungay Road with his youngest, Walter, a Clerk in a Merchant's Office (maybe Woods, Sadd, Moore?). They are listed next to Alfred Ward who by this time owned Rose Cottage.

In April 1899 George was a witness at the Inquest of Alfred Merry Ship. Alfred Ship's widow Maria later married George Herbert White, George's eldest son, who had also returned to Loddon and ran a business as a carrier (taking over from Alfred Merry Ship?). George Herbert and Maria lived in The Grove, one of the properties that George senior owned.

Youngest son Walter went off to work Deptford in a confectioner's shop later moving into the butchery business in Greenwich.

William Theophilus White the middle son joined the Cambridgeshire Constabulary.

George lived in the High Bungay Road until his death on February 12th 1924, after which probate was granted to his son George Herbert White, a Carrier. His effects were £175.10s

He is buried in the Churchyard in the family plot, to the right of the footpath leading from the Church Porch to the Beccles Road.

"Consequences," by Penelope Lively

Penelope Lively is extremely good at writing family-based novels and this one has to be one of her very best. It begins in the 1930s and goes on through three generations, the link being chiefly the women of each of the generations through the years - first Lorna, then Molly and finally Ruth. This is a truly beautiful book which can absorb a reader utterly. If you choose to read it, do not be surprised to find yourself smiling frequently at times and being moved to tears at other times. The story is not just about the women; there are, of course, men of real interest too. For characterisation, description, empathy and the sheer understanding of humanity there is nobody better than this author.

"Sarum," by Edward Rutherfurd

This is one of the best historical novels ever written. If you are interested in reading it, be prepared for a long read - it has more than 1,300 pages! (Perfect for something to enjoy during lockdown). As you would think from the title, the setting is the Salisbury/Stonehenge region of England. It begins thousands of years ago and finishes shortly after the end of World War II. Five families link this novel which gives a wonderful picture of the way our civilisation has developed. It is full of fascinating characters and happenings through the ages, describing the ups and downs of people in every century, good and bad. One of the blurbs given inside the cover says, "Bursting with action, supremely well crafted and a delight to read." Very true.

"The Future Homemakers of America," by Laurie Graham

Set mainly in America, but at times in England - particularly in the Fenland area of East Anglia - this is a very good story of the lives of several women who are married to USA Airmen and who form friendships with each other which last lifelong. While over here in East Anglia they become friends with a young English woman called Kath, and that friendship too becomes a lifelong one. The female characters are very different from one another as are their Airmen husbands, and they come to life vividly under the pen of Laurie Graham. Her descriptions of the differences between the England and America of the post-war time of the 1950s are really interesting, the quality of life for much of that time in the two countries being very different. It is an excellent and rather unusual novel.

Nature Notes It was Jan 21st, the second day of high winds brought to us courtesy of storm Christoph. I decided to walk the dogs around the circuit starting at Chedgrave Church and across Chedgrave Common. I had my binoculars with me but because of the wind I didn't expect to see anything much. To confirm this, by the time I was walking along the alleyway behind the church I had only seen a Wood Pigeon and a Black Headed Gull. Then walking down towards the footpath that takes you along the Chet to the Common, the sound of the wind in the trees was interrupted by the harsh call of a couple of Jays, one of which was very obligingly out in the open. Expecting this to be the highlight of the walk my attention was then drawn to a small bird flitting about among the vegetation along the Chet. It was perching on the top of stems which gave me good views of what was a female stonechat. A little further along the path and I saw the male, although not in his full spring attire he was still a very handsome little bird. On reaching the Common I proceeded to walk along the fence line by the trees, while the dogs enjoyed some freedom. Scanning through a small flock of goldfinches at the top of some Alder trees I realised it was in fact a mixed flock also containing Lesser Redpoll and Siskin. This walk was got better and better, wind or no wind. Leaving the Common a male Bullfinch suddenly appeared in the hedge; then topped by a couple of buzzards flying overhead. Not bad on a windy day!

Earlier that day, in Seething I watched a Barn Owl trying to fly in the wind, it kept landing in the road, so I kept having to stop. I got brilliant views of it through the windscreen.

Our garden bird list has finally moved forward again, a male Stonechat seen on the marshes perching on reeds and fence posts. There seems to be a good few of them about this year.

Driving into Chedgrave the other morning just before it was fully light, we noticed something moving ahead of us along the side if the road. Fortunately, it decided to cross over the road, and we were confronted by a fox, the white tip to its tail was very obvious. It was the first time Rachel had ever seen one in the wild. You never know what might turn up.

I know recently in Nature Notes I mentioned the fact that I hadn't seen Green Sandpipers overwintering in this area for the last couple of years. Well, whilst out with the dogs recently walking this time along the bank of the river Chet towards Hardley Cross, I heard a bird call and was able to locate it flying away from me. Its size and prominent white rump led me to identify it as a Green Sandpiper. On a different day in the same area, but this time the silence of the countryside was periodically broken by gun fire from both sides of the river. Suddenly a bird flew across our path from the woods opposite us and by its colour and general shape I knew it was a Woodcock. Woodcocks don't normally fly during the day and are very well camouflaged, it had been flushed from its resting place in the woods.

Today it is snowing, yet Spring is on the way. Recently I have heard Song and Mistle Thrush singing, along with Skylark. A friend recently told me how they were enjoying the dawn chorus, the bonus being you don't have to get up early to hear it! **Richard and Rachel Hull**

Gardening Notes

From the Allotment March is **THE** time for planting, but the British weather can be very changeable, so you need to vary planting times based on the conditions. Don't rush to plant seeds or tubers if its frosty or the ground is waterlogged. Wait for the right conditions and the plants will catch up all on their own.

As we enter the 'Hungry Gap' I am still eating stored onions, potatoes and garlic (going over now) and picking autumn sown carrots, winter sown lettuce and rocket and frozen soft fruit. The latter not an option available to our ancestors.

The autumn planted broad beans are well up and the spring broad beans are in and showing, the autumn planted early garlic is well advanced, and even the late harvest variety is appearing. My potatoes are chitting and I would like to get the first and second earlies in soon. I know this will expose the growing tips to the inevitable late frosts. I will protect against this by covering them with straw or fleece when a frost is imminent. I will also plant my parsnip seeds as soon as the ground has warmed up as they are slow to germinate.

I will also sow seeds in the greenhouse (or on a windowsill) for tomatoes, chillies, aubergines, and peppers. Last year I had a good crop of peppers from the seed of a supermarket pepper and I know another allotmenteer who had good results with saved seeds from tomatoes. So I may give it a try.

From the garden-What a difference a year makes, this time last year I was looking forward to the spring show, suddenly it was lockdown, working from home and zoom meetings. Hopefully when you read this we will be arranging to meet up with friends and family. I started the new year with a couple of zoom talks, one with Adrian Bloom of Bressingham Gardens, - The Winter Garden, planted with trees, conifers and perennials is glorious in summer and well worth a visit, but the star in winter was the Cornus sanguinea Midwinter Fire. White flowers in May/ June, berries in the Autumn, bright orange/red stems in winter. Prune a third of stems to the ground in spring to ensure young colourful stems. Plant in full sun, overall height and spread 2m. The second was a talk with Simon White from Peter Beales Roses, a whistle stop tour of 25 gardens in East Anglia, and many more missed! A brief visit and a little history on each one was enough for me to start planning road trips for the summer. Simon mentioned the slug free hostas on display in some of the gardens and the use of a product called Strulch which is disliked by slugs and snails. Now off to sow more seeds and dead head the bulbs.
