Services Online this Week

Services in Church Buildings

David Owen has been consulting with the PCCs and clergy across our churches as to when it will be right to re-start services in church. Inevitably, it is easier to stop something than to discern the process of re-starting it, but David's decision is:-

- To re-open All Saints and Holy Trinity for Sunday worship on Palm Sunday (March 28th)
- To resume regular Sunday worship in Loddon (HT), Chedgrave, Hardley and Sisland from Easter Day onwards. Activities planned for the Benefice in Holy Week can also take place.

All this is provided there are no further restrictions put in place. David says "It is not until 29 March that 6 people or 2 households will generally be allowed to meet, and only from then will the 'stay at home' injunction end. The Church of England's Guidance strongly advises a slow and careful approach. The Archdeacons of the Diocese have also reminded us that no congregational singing at all is allowed, either indoors or out. I'm aware that there are those who would like see an immediate return and those who want to wait longer because they still need to shield. For the time being we will therefore also continue with online worship."

Remember Annual Meetings??


